Inmates come to Jail at various seasons of the year and leave in different climate conditions.

Jesse Mosa – One of the Harvest!

I was a 7 time felon, and a recovering drug addict. I've gone to prison twice and I was a gang member. I only used to look for God when I got locked up. Most of the Polk County Jail staff knows me by name, and all the red team does too. I first met Jerry when he would bring the word in Bible studies and Bibles for us. Two times I

asked this man on his way out of the pod if he would please pray with me, and both times were right before I went to prison. There was no hesitation in this man to lay his hand on my shoulder and just ask Jesus to keep me safe and to protect me. Maybe one day He would open my eyes to where I was no longer an addict or doing dumb stuff. I went to prison for just over 18 months and got out in August of 2020. By the end of October 2020 I was back in jail because of methamphetamine. I was still an addict, but I had a
