He talked to a man in his housing unit who had a relationship with the Lord, and chose to have me bring him a Bible instead to read. I knew God was at work so I scheduled a meeting with him. He told me of multiple times of deep woundedness. After sharing he was ready to heal. You see the Bible states, confess your sins one to another and pray for one another, that you may be healed James 5:16. I shared with him that to forgive one must be forgiven. He had spent many years in prison sharpening his attitudes of hatred. At the same time he was drawn to a teacher of a Bible study, so he began to attend. From this new information I knew God had been working to sow seed in his life. It was time to share the love and forgiveness of Jesus Christ, and His atoning work on the cross. It's so hard to let go of what has hold of us.

Unforgiveness, holding grudges, and hating people are so exhausting. No wonder Jesus said, Come to Me all who are weary and heavy laden and I will give you rest Matt. 11:28. This man was finally ready to surrender his life to Christ. The atmosphere in the room changed, and so did his attitude. When he prayed and surrendered his heart to Jesus Christ, his brand new life began.

I was conceived out of wedlock, and born 12/17/63. My maternal grandfather was a true German/Jew and grandmother, an Irish/Indian who was abused on the reservation in the 1920's. They were to marry immediately, and it only lasted two years. My upbringing was abusive in multiple facets of physical, mental, emotional, molestation, alcohol addiction, multiple marriages and divorces, not speaking families, turmoil and facade. Mom was now single in the 60's and dad went to Vietnam. I

was blessed to be able to spend most of my preschool years with both my Great and Grand parents. They taught me the story of Jesus' birth, that He died for our sins and why. We could go to Heaven to be with the Lord and that He would one day judge the living and the dead. They taught me about the Devil too. My Great Grandma was a Baptist Bible school teacher. She took care of and taught me childhood prayers for my daddy's safe return and my list of thank yous.

Although Grama was a Baptist Sunday school teacher and that was my foundation I was baptized Catholic days after birth, made confession,1st communion, and confirmation in 10th grade. It wasn't long after that I began to look at church as a set of nothing but rules and in high school I met different kids, with different religions and rules. Isn't there only one God? This isn't right. I slowly fell away from the structure of the church not realizing that the church was the people. Some 30 years later I became a two time honors graduate in nursing, was a nurse educator, a leader in the community, owner of a successful restaurant, and had three successful grown children. At the same time I was abused, bruised, beaten, thrown from a moving vehicle, cheated on, drank to excess, and could not complete my continuing education. I got a DWI charge, withdrew, lost my home, lost touch, and my children distanced themselves. Bad people flocked around, and stole from me. It became very dark, very fast. I met a beautiful man with a meth addiction and fell in love at first sight. I believe the Lord told me not to ever give up on him. Along with Joe came a level of family commitment and addiction I didn't understand but tried to come along with him. After countless poor judgments on everyone's part I got myself into the most shameful moment of my life. After a few days of drinking

and partying my sister in law and I were headed for disaster. We got into an escalated argument which became physical. A few days later she and the police showed up at my house to arrest me for assault. On 09/19 I landed in the lost and found at the Polk County Jail. I was taken, booked, lost, and ashamed. I sat in complete silence staring as tear after tear fell to the floor. I had nobody. No family. No money. No phone call. No commissary. No visit. No knowledge of Angela. I was lonely, shamed and desperate for restitution but how? A girl walked over, Dawn? Yea, I say. Bible study, me? Maybe next time, thank you. I felt something about 1 minute later touch me. I really did and swore I heard, "Go He's waiting." I was close enough to see Chaplain Jerry, as he was filling in with a movie called *Every 15 Minutes*. Afterward he offered to pray and asked if I wanted to accept Jesus as my Lord and Savior? I said yes. I thank Jerry for his assistance and for the Lord rescuing me from the lost and now I'm found. 2 Corinthians
