By doing so, you can help reduce the number of cats and kittens who end up in shelters or are homeless each year. If you're seeking spay or neuter services for your pet, we recommend trying the following:

Low Cost Spay & Neuter--Flatbush Cats

They provide spay/neuter surgery and preventative care, like wellness exams and vaccinations, for cats and dogs. NOT emergencies. You can request an appointment from their website.

Request a spay/neuter certificate: Friends of Animals
