




Student K9.0 Robotics Team - Building Robots and a future in STEAM

Leon Pryor, Coach of the 8280 K9.0 Robotics Team at School at Marygrove, Detroit, Michigan, is a University of Michigan alum and a senior game producer at Meta. He became involved in robotics competitions in 2018 when his son was an elementary school student in the Detroit Schools and competed in a FIRST (For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology) Robotics Competition. Pryor went on to develop and lead two youth robotics teams to success, and the Motor City Alliance, a 501c3 organization that works among over 100 metro Detroit elementary and middle school teams, furthering their robotics creativity, coding language skills and team dynamics. FIRST Robotics school teams design and build robots to compete in an annual contest.

Of his 8280 K9.0 Team, Pryor stated: "We are one of the most successful Robotics Teams from Detroit ever. Despite being a young team, we have moved quickly to set the bar for Detroit high school robotics, and this year we have won awards that no other Detroit team has achieved in 35 years of competition. This includes the Impact Award (formerly Chairman's) for social activation and spreading the message of STEM. Also, we were recently spotlit during Juneteenth 2024 demonstrating our Robot on the local NBC News - K9 Juneteenth (youtube.com)".

Pryor said exposing kids early to STEM/STEAM and problem solving will help them fit into the future economy and jobs landscape. Michigan will see more than 16,000 job openings in STEAM fields annually through 2028, according to a recent report on long-term employment projections from the Michigan Bureau of Labor Market Information and Strategic Initiatives.

Thank you to Coach Leon Pryor and the 8280 K9.0 Robotics Team for all that you do in inspiring and enlightening everyone about the fascinating world of Robotics.
