The Opportunity

One of our kids at the Huntsville Learning Center has dealt with a vision condition called Strabismus, a misalignment of the eye. Often caused by weakness in the eye muscles responsible for movement, strabismus can cause serious vision issues including lazy eye, blurry vision, headaches, double vision, and poor depth-perception.

The Need

This young man's family has come a long way with the help of the Huntsville Learning Center and our community of supporters; however, the cost of his surgery, which kept the family from moving forward with the procedure for several years, would have put a significant strain on their finances—especially during the holiday season. In faith, they set the surgery for 12/21/2023. On December 20th, they still owed \$2,115 to the Surgery Center and an additional amount to the surgeon. The operation could not take place unless both fees were paid in full. With the help of Living Acts, the family only had to cover the cost of the surgeon and was able to go through with the procedure!



The Outcome

The surgery was very successful! This wonderful child could not see for the first day or two—which is common with this procedure—but he recovered right on schedule. After the winter break, he started school and returned to the Learning Center with the rest of his peers. Although he could not participate in physical activities, he was able to get back into all of our other offerings. The most important part of this surgery was improving and protecting this young man's sight, but it has had another major impact: since his return, there has been a noticeable increase in his confidence! He and his family are beyond grateful!
