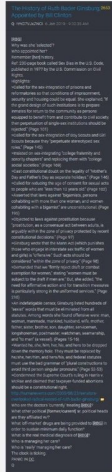

those who engage in interstate sex traffic of women
and girls) is "offensive." Such acts should be
considered "within the zone of privacy." (Page 98)

>Demanded that we "firmly reject draft or combat
exemption for women," stating "women must be
subject to the draft if men are." But, she added, "the
need for affirmative action and for transition measures
is particularly strong in the uniformed services." (Page
218)

>An indefatigable censor, Ginsburg listed hundreds of
"sexist" words that must be eliminated from all
statutes. Among words she found offensive were: man,
woman, manmade, mankind, husband, wife, mother,
father, sister, brother, son, daughter, serviceman,
longshoreman, postmaster, watchman, seamanship,
and "to man" (a vessel). (Pages 15-16)

Potential nominee profile: Amy Coney Barrett

In November 2017, President Donald Trump released a revised list of potential Supreme Court nominees. The November 2017 list was an expanded version of two earlier lists, announced during the 2016 presidential campaign, from which then-candidate Trump pledged, if elected, to pick a successor to the late Justice Antonin Scalia, who died on February 13, 2016. First on the new list – because it was in alphabetical order – was Amy Coney Barrett, a Notre Dame law professor (and former Scalia clerk) who had recently been confirmed to a seat on the U.S. Court of Appeals for the 7th Circuit. Barrett's confirmation hearings had received considerable attention after Democrats on the Senate Judiciary Committee – most notably, Senator Dianne Feinstein of California – grilled her on the role of her Catholic faith in judging. Feinstein's criticism did not stop Barrett from being confirmed, and since then there has been speculation that it may have in fact strengthened her case to fill the seat that will be vacated by the retirement of Justice Anthony Kennedy.

Reuters: Trump says U.S. is having tremendous success with China on trade

Washington. President Donald Trump said on Thursday the United States was having tremendous success in its trade negotiations with China, a day after U.S. and Chinese officials concluded three days of talks in Beijing.

The meetings in China were the first face-to-face talks since Trump and Chinese President Xi Jinping met in Buenos Aires in December and agreed a 90-day truce in a trade war that has disrupted the flow of hundreds of billions of dollars of goods.

Trump, a Republican, has accused China of cheating the United States on trade and stealing U.S. intellectual property, though he often has said he has a good personal rapport with Xi.

"We're negotiating and having tremendous success with China," Trump told reporters as he left the White House on a trip to the U.S. border with Mexico on the 20th day of a partial shutdown of the U.S. government. He did not elaborate.

He added that he found China to be in many ways "far more honorable" than congressional Democratic leaders Senator Chuck Schumer and House Speaker Nancy Pelosi.

Trump is locked in a stalemate with congressional Democrats over his demand for \$5.7 billion in partial funding to build a wall on the U.S.-Mexico border. The dispute triggered a shutdown of about one-quarter of the federal government, and Trump has said he will not sign any bill to reopen the government that does not include funding for the wall.

"I think that China is actually much easier to deal with than the opposition party," he said.

Washington has presented Beijing with a long list of demands that would rewrite the terms of trade between the world's two largest economies. They include changes to China's policies on intellectual property protection, technology transfers, industrial subsidies and other non-tariff barriers to trade.


Some 40 days into the 90-day truce, there were few concrete details on progress made so far. The meetings in Beijing this week were not at a ministerial level, so were not expected to produce a deal to end the trade war.
