#### **Outrageous show** includes dinner

The Ogden band Outrageous will perform at a dinner show this weekend at Saltair resort.

The dinner and dancing event, called "Outrageous Affair at the Great Saltair,' will begin at 6 p.m. Saturday in the new Five Spot Cafe, recently opened in the Saltair Pavilion, west of Salt Lake City.

Outrageous bills itself as "Utah's own '60s and '70s rock band." The group, which was known as Still Rain 30 years ago, performs originals, as well as covers of songs by the Rolling Stones, the Beach Boys, The Rascals, Chicago, Aretha Franklin, The Temptations, Creedence Clearwater Revival and more. Today, Outrageous is a 10-piece band, complete with a horn section, and it has opened for Three Dog Night, Tommy James and the Shondells, Johnny Rivers, Don McLean and others.

Members of the band are Stu Young on keyboard, trombone and vocals; Marcellus Adams on saxophone; Steve Kaufman on bass guitar and lead vocals; Rachelle Stowell and Shauna Durbano on lead vocals; Michael Schoenfeld on lead guitar and lead vocals; Ron Nichols on drums, percussion and blues harmonica; and Ray Barrios and Clint Frohm on trumpet and flugelhorn.

At the concert, Outrageous will perform rock and Motown hits from the late 1960s and early 1970s.

Cost for the dinner and entertainment is \$20 in advance, \$25 at the door. Dinner will include Tuscan roasted chicken with potatoes, vegetables and a beverage. The event is being held in a no-smoking venue.

OGDEN - Weber State University faculty member Thomas Priest presents a bassoon recital here next week.




