<sup>\*</sup>This Daily Planning System for Individualized Education must be developed based on the Strengths-based Assessment.

<sup>\*</sup>Put all activities in a Visual schedule or Daily Written schedule (if the student is older and reads), available for the student to see. Schedule icons should be in a strip or folder, in sequence.

<sup>\*</sup>Initially make transition supports by having cues or signals in the environment: time or clock, transition symbols such as pictures of places the student will go to for the next activity or the next activity.

<sup>\*</sup>Make the materials and have them available for all access and accommodation supports.

<sup>\*</sup>All other materials for reinforcement, work systems and generalization should be made available.

<sup>\*</sup>Prompt Levels: I: Independent / TD: Time Delay 3-5 seconds / G: Gestural / P: Partial / F: Full T

<sup>\*</sup>Reinforcers/Reinforcement: E: Edibles / A: Activities / T: Tangibles / So: Social / Se: Sensory
