

City of Phoenix 2020-2024 Five Year Consolidated Plan 2020-2021 Annual Action Plan Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice Study Public Notice

The City of Phoenix has prepared drafts of the 2020-2024 Consolidated Plan, the 2020-2021 Annual Action Plan and the Analysis of Fair Housing Choice Study.

The 2020-24 Consolidated Plan defines strategies to address housing and community development needs in the City of Phoenix for the next five years. The plan contains the application requirements for the four HUD programs administered by the City, which include: Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnership (HOME), Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG), and Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA).

The 2020-21 Annual Action Plan describes how funds will be used to address the priorities and achieve the goals outlined in the first year of the five-year Consolidated Plan, while the Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice study will help identify and overcome obstacles to fair housing choice.

The draft documents will be available for review and public comment from June 1 – June 5, 2020 at https://www.phoenix.gov/nsd/reports

A virtual public hearing will be held on Tuesday, June 2, 2020, from 12:30 p.m. to 1:30 p.m.
