













WHAT TO DO AFTER THE STORM

-  Never use your generator indoors, or within 20 ft of an open door, window, vent to your home
-  Never use grills and camp stoves indoors or within 20 ft of an open door, window or vent to your home
-  Stay out of floodwater – it can harbor disease, downed powerlines and wildlife
-  Never use a wet electrical device
-  If power is out, use flashlights and lanterns instead of candles
-  Stay away from downed powerlines. Report to the electrical company
-  Do not enter damaged buildings until authorities determine it is safe
-  Do not consume perishable food that has gone bad during the power outage
-  Stay tuned to local news/radio regarding unsafe water and issues with sewage pumping stations
-  In case of damage to your home, take photos and start a claim with your insurance company as soon as possible
-  Take reasonable actions to protect your property from further damage
-  Check on your neighbors
