- Ensure your decisions and actions contribute to a safe environment.
- ✓ Ensure your decisions and actions contribute to a harassment-free environment.
- ✓ Do not tolerate abusive, bullying, or threatening behaviour.

Participants

- ✓ Always give your best.
- ✓ Participate for your own enjoyment and benefit.
- ✓ Play by the rules and show respect for other participants, Instructors, Coaches and Officials.

Instructors/Coaches

- Place the safety and welfare of the participants above all else.
- Help each person (athlete, official, etc.) to reach their potential. Respect the talent, developmental stage and goals of each person and encourage them with positive and constructive feedback.
- Obtain appropriate qualifications and keep up to date with the latest coaching practices and the principles of growth and development of young players.
- Ensure that any physical contact with another person is appropriate to the situation and necessary for the person's skill development.

- Reject the use of harassment, bullying or violence in any form, whether by other Spectators, Instructors, Coaches, Officials or Participants.
