The Foundation is dedicated to helping individuals and their families who are struggling with substance use disorder.

Sober Home Scholarships

The Think of Michael Foundation has identified a real need that exists with people transitioning from detox and/or treatment to a sober house. Our goal is to enable those people who need and want to continue to aftercare and sober house living to have access to it.

Many do not have a job or the funds to take advantage of sober house living. It is for many people a critical component of their recovery. One that is not covered by insurance. Without a place to stay or not wanting to return to an environment that may have contributed to their disorder, living at a sober house provides them the structure and support necessary for them to transition to a life of sobriety.

We have established a network of clinicians and recovery coaches who refer individuals to us that they feel can truly benefit from sober house living. That is followed by a letter from the individual in which they share with us their background and why they think that a stay at a sober house will be beneficial to them. The cost per month for a sober house scholarship typically ranges from \$700 to \$1,000. The Foundation, through your continued generosity, has never denied an eligible applicant.

MICHAEL'S STORY

Michael Dalton was smart, compassionate, and resilient. Growing up in Lynnfield, MA, he developed his passion for hockey and football. On and off the field and ice, he was a fierce competitor. He was a talented athlete. Playing for St. Sebastian's and then Colby College were his most memorable and special times.

More than his love of sports was his love for his family and friends. Those who knew him best remember his contagious smile paired with a magnetic personality.

He was a loving father to his son Mason, a devoted son to Richard and Carmela, an amazing brother to Stacey and Jamie, brother-in-law to Jonathan and cherished uncle to Madeline, Lucas and Ava. He was a nephew, a cousin and a great friend to all.

On January 13, 2018 Michael passed tragically from an opiate overdose while in outpatient treatment. Our hearts were shattered and none of us will ever be the same. As we still adjust to the reality of life without Michael, we, as a family, need to ensure that something good comes out of our greatest loss.

The Think of Michael Foundation has expanded beyond sober scholarships to include various other support services. Our outreach includes:

This community event is not a fundraiser but rather an opportunity to come together for a march, a candlelight vigil and speakers sharing their experience, strength, and hope.
