Upon graduation, I worked for a therapeutic preschool that served children ages 3-6 diagnosed with ADHD, Oppositional Defiance Disorder, Autism Disorder, Separation Anxiety, and severe emotional/behavioral difficulties.

In 2005-2007, I pursued my M.S.W. from Rutgers University. During my internships, I worked in a substance abuse program for teens at a hospital, where I provided individual/group treatment for teens ages 14-19, all mandated by the court system. I also interned for an agency providing individual, group, and family therapy for children ages 3-12 who come from homes affected by domestic violence.

Upon graduation, I was hired by the agency that offered my second internship placement, and I remained there as a full-time clinician from 2007-2014. As an LCSW in 2009, I started The In-Home Parent Coach®, and since 2015, I have worked solely for my company.

I have spent over 15 years working with hundreds of challenging toddlers through teenagers diagnosed with A.D.H.D, Oppositional Defiance Disorder, Conduct Disorder, Bi-polar, and Autism-Spectrum Disorders. I have worked with children and their families in hospitals, mental health facilities, and I currently provide In-Home Services. I work with boys and girls (ages 2-19) with severe emotional/behavioral issue from various ethnic backgrounds, races, and religions.

I believe that parents can gain the leadership skills necessary to restore order in the home, strengthen the bond between parent/child, and reconnect with their children. I am highly attuned to the leadership process and verbal/nonverbal communication skills to bring peace back into the home.

I have personally provided services in over 200 homes, and I continue to work within home environments today. My unique "on the front line of battle" experiences make me a powerful catalyst for change when working with families. Through reprogramming, exploration, guidance, and direct training, my clients learn to confront their fears, plan effectively, and take the steps to reclaim their parental power.
