STATE OF THE STABLE

The warm temperatures have been hanging on FOREVER. And finally - after Halloween, temperatures began to feel like fall was peeking over the fence. So, as the 2017 Holiday Season approaches it's time to say thank you to everyone who has supported us this past year. I wish all of you a wonderful holiday season and a prosperous 2018.

Summer 2017 seemed hotter than 2016. Not sure it was actually hotter, but it lingered for a long time. Two riders braved August riding in New River and 1 rode in Mesa. Our Twentieth ride year began in September, and due to the heat, started out with only 12 riders. Two more joined us as it cooled down, but we are still way below last year's numbers. Three new riders joined our family of riders - Bella in Mesa, Lincoln and Megha in Peoria.

Seeing our riders come back after the summer is always fun.. We are continuing to have our riders play with their horses on the ground before mounting up - called "On-Line". This helps our riders with learning to observe where their horse needs to go to do an obstacle, learning when to be quiet, when to ask for more and improves their balance. It's been very helpful. Bella, Brittany, Irish, Julia, Lauryan, Megha, Tristyn and Veronica are all improving their on-line skills - which is helping their mounted skills and posture. Highlights - Irish, Julia and Phillip are riding using only 1 rein. It has improved their focus and posture a lot. Lincoln loves to ride in positions and is pretty impressed when he pulls on the neck rope and Freckles stops for him - he's only 3. Natalie is tossing bean bags 8-10 feet into a bucket. Brittany and Lauryan are getting more advanced with their Parelli Games. Veronica is focused and getting connected with Stetson. Katelyn and LoriAnne are holding the neck rope and learning to whoa by pulling it back. Daniel is beginning to rein Indie and is increasing his vocabulary as he talks to the farm horses. Jenny is learning ground games with Indie and is saying more words each time. That's the way to go! Keep up the great work everyone.

Officers - Our officers, Chris, Craig and Bob keep everything running smoothly.

Staff - Instructors, Chris and Barb, continue guiding our riders. Barb is our Thursday instructor for riders in Mesa. Thank you Barb and all our volunteers for helping. Barb, Elaine and Farleigh organize horse care/training in Mesa. Chris handles the classes on Sunday, Monday and Wednesdays in New River, Mesa and Peoria respectively. Chris works horses 4 days a week as well as handles cleaning pens and feeding the herd in New River. Elaine, Farleigh, and now Lauryan, take care of Indie and Stetson in Mesa.

Horses - Adopt a Horse and get "Carrot Privileges". In Mesa - Jewel and Lulu have retired and both are doing well. Jewel moved to Alabama to be with her grand-foals and Lulu is in Buckeye helping Jose recover from a back injury. New to us are Indie, a "teenage" palomino mare, who came in June. She gave lessons for many years and is great for our riders. She was standing around and wanted something to do - so Trish offered her to us. Indie is not ours yet - but it looks like that will happen. Stetson, who came in November, is an 18 year old Polish Arabian gelding. He is owned by Lauryan's family, but was in Maricopa so Lauryan, in Mesa, had little time with him. We checked him out and moved him to Mesa where Lauryan is learning to work with him and he is learning to work with us. He was a 100 mile endurance horse - and Elaine and Farleigh are working hard to let him know he doesn't have to go fast ALL THE TIME. Thank you to Elaine and Farleigh for exercising our Mesa horses. The hot summer we just had was hard on all the horses and the people who play with them, so we took it easy. Dakota, Freckles and Liber-T are working in New River and Peoria. Dakota is more confident each time we ride and now having riders ride with 1 rein.. Freckles and Liber-T are doing well working with their riders. Freckles is - - Freckles. Trusting

and cooperative as she helps our riders learn. She loves her time with all her riders each week. Liber-T is working with her riders and really tasks them to "do it right," which at times can be frustrating. But the payoff is some amazing connections with her riders. Idol - our sweet Idol, had a stroke in June which affected her hindquarters making her movement very awkward. Then in October, she had another and ended up at the Rainbow Bridge with her mother, Shasta. We miss her. Horse upkeep costs have not increased much this year. Horse board is a cost we have monthly no matter how many riders we have. The Equine Dentist is due and that will be about \$700 this year. We have 2 horses in Mesa and 3 in New River. Thank you to the Morris family, The Outlander Private Foundation, the Romo Family and Hudsons for supporting our horses.

Program - Costs for each rider are at \$420 for a 6-week session. Each year, we have new riders, and some, SIGH, have moved along because they achieved their goals - but that's a good thing. We are looking for a new ride site in the Cave Creek/north Scottsdale area. R & B Ranch is up for sale and we need a new location. Currently our Cave Creek riders are riding in New River and Peoria - but Cave Creek area would be better for them. Our costs remain pretty stable. Horses cost - what horses cost. Less riders to share the costs require more donations to fill the gap or we must increase rider fees. All of our riders have always paid a discounted fee to mirror what anyone would pay for a riding lesson - and we are a non-profit so we can receive funding to bridge our expenses. Fundraising and donations keep fees down for riders and provide for the difference. Donations last year were \$14,500, which is better than the \$11,000 from 2016, but a far cry from \$47,000 in 2009. Our classes at Stable Influence, Soft Wind Riding Club and Tyler Farms are going well. We have space for more riders in Mesa. Thank you Wanda, Scott, Donna, MaryAnn, and of course Craig for your support. AND thank you to Sue for supporting us for 12 years at R & B Ranch. More volunteers at all our locations will be welcomed and would be a big help.

I update our Facebook page every week with fun pictures and news. Feel free to share your stories, and our stories and information, with everyone you know. Spread the word of our riders' challenges and how they succeed through the work our volunteers do. Join the fun, jot a message or share your story for everyone to enjoy. Ask friends to gift - just \$10 - to our Poop Bucket Challenge, become one of the 100 for \$100 donors, buy a \$10 "Outlander T-Shirt raffle ticket. Share miracles you have seen our riders achieve. horse care costs and without our horses, there is no program. Hay costs for our horses in New River has remained stable, but \$5,500 worth of hay was purchased and stacked this fall. Stable Influence has not been able to cover the board cost for New River horses. Funding for these expenses is necessary. We have our Horse Board Fund and the "Poop Bucket Challenge" with the goal to fill a poop bucket with \$10 bills. You can Adopt a Horse and support one of our wonderful horses.
