# Lords and Ladies - To Your Horses - Please 20<sup>th</sup> Annual Stable Influence Horse Show by Cristina Fauste

Lords and Ladies, we've successfully ended another year with a delightful horse show! Who knew, a score ago, that we'd be here, still showing off our skills and having fun cheering on our riders? We were fortunate enough to be able to hold our annual show at the Soft Wind Riding Club again this year, and what a year it's been!

This year we had a great team again, with Cristina organizing the show, Jen providing the snacks, Elaine and Farleigh creating gorgeous decorations and goodie bags, as well as helping at the front desk, Charlene organizing the silent auction, Barb creating the obstacle course, and Darla returning as our judge for the event. Chris of course worked with all the riders all year long, helping them hone their skills with the horses, and created the programs, Craig worked hard to set up the obstacle course for us! Volunteers helped in all areas, set-up, Judge's assistant, pole bending timers, check-in, silent auction table, horse care, rider leaders and side safety aides - Alex, Dorian, Sue, Lisa, Elaine, Katrina, Sandie, Parker, Lori, Kayla and Laura.

Bright and early on April 7<sup>th</sup>, volunteers started rolling in, immediately jumping to help set up tents and tables, pole bending and obstacle course, and getting the horses ready to go. Everyone was so enthusiastic to help, and worked seamlessly to have everything ready by the time the first riders started to show up. Our volunteers were quick to help the riders walk the course and see how the day would go. And then the show began!

What a wonderful thing to see everyone cheering on these riders as they demonstrated all the hard work and dedication they put into their skills this year. From on-line skills, to pole bending, to navigating a tough obstacle course, everyone rocked their divisions! A nice breeze also helped to keep everyone cool, which is always nice this time of year. The look on the rider's faces when they got their awards was something to be proud of!

Our first event this year, was On-Line, in which the riders worked with their horses on the ground, demonstrating impressive skills at playing the basic games; Friendly, Porcupine, Driving, and Yo-Yo. These games included some tough things like driving the horse over a tarp, or asking the horse to stand in a hula-hoop for 7 seconds. It was fun to have the spectators join in counting those 7 seconds for each rider. Other things included side-passing over a pole and going over a cavaletti! Both our Beginners and Intermediate classes could earn a potential 60 points in their respective divisions. Bella Hickey, Veronica Montalvo, and Lauryan McQuaid earned the full 60 points each, and Irish Smith earned a bonus 10 points for repositioning her horse using the Yo-Yo game for a total of 70 points. Fantastic job, everyone!

Our second event had only 1 participant. It's called Lead Line and is for riders who are very much beginner riders. Autumn rode Freckles as volunteers spotted. The goal for this event is the rider is balanced and focused - and looking "cute" is something all easily have. Autumn has that going 110%.

Our third event included Pole Bending. We had; Division 1- Walk Only 2/3 Aides: 1st Place- Autumn (time 1:37) and 2nd-Bella (time1:57). In Division 2- Walk Only 1 Aide or Independent: 1st Place- Veronica (time 1:28) and 2nd- Phillip Cocklin (time 1:59). In Division 4- Minimum Trot 1 Aide or Independent: 1st Place- Irish (time 1:03). In Division 5- Advanced Trot: 1st Place- Lauryan (time 56 seconds). In Division 6- Minimum Canter: 1st Place- Brittany (time 53 seconds).

The fourth event was the Obstacle Course: Division 1 Walk Only 2/3 Aides: 1st Place- Autumn, 2nd Bella. Division 2 Walk Only 1 Aide or Independent: 1st Place- Phillip, 2nd-Veronica Montalvo. Division 4 Minimum Trot 1 Aide or Independent: 1st Place- Irish. Division 5 Advanced Trot: 1st Place- Lauryan. Division 6 Minimum Canter: 1st Place- Brittany.

Our last event - Natural Equitation: Division 4: 1st Place-Irish. Division 5: 1st Place-Lauryan. Division 6: 1st Place-Brittany.

Everyone was so excited to get their medals and awards at the end. We are so proud of each and every one of our riders who put so much effort into their riding skills- it's hard to do! We had a wonderful silent auction with some awesome prizes, and the snacks were yummy! All of our volunteers were so helpful in helping take everything down, from deconstructing the arena, to putting away the tables and tents, and cleaning the horses. We couldn't have done it all without everyone pitching in. A special thanks to all our wonderful sponsors. Thank you so much for such a fantastic show!

#### STATE OF THE STABLE

Our 20<sup>th</sup> year - WOW. It's hard to believe we've been helping people for 20 years. WOW - AGAIN. Also want to give a BIG THANK YOU to everyone who has supported us by volunteering, making donations or bringing us riders. Your support has helped to make Stable Influence Charity Programs the successful Equine Assisted Activities and Therapy program it is.

Some rider highlights this past year include - - - 3 new riders joined our family this year. Irish and Julia began to trot and do point-to-point exercises. Lauryan trotted ALL THE TIME and on her family's horse Stetson, who we were blessed to play with this year. She also learned the pleasure of a canter while on Freckles at the horse show - she wants more of that. Natalie, Jenny and Daniel are increasing their verbalization. Megha has increased her VOLUME and focus. Katelyn and LoriAnn are holding a neck rope longer and longer and can ask their horse to stop by pulling back. Bella, Brittany, Irish, Julia, Lauryan, Megha, Tristyn and Veronica are doing some amazing things with on-line work. Brittany is working on finesse with her riding. Daniel, Jenny and Bella are using reins better each ride. Phillip continues to ride more patterns independently. These special moments make us all smile and confirm to us that we are doing what we should be doing. We have improved the lives of over 450 riders since 1998. Some have been riding with us from the beginning. WOW!!

Program - For FY17 we averaged only 15 half-hour riding lessons each week. This was 8 less than FY17 and about half of what we would like to have. I believe some of that was due to the very hot and long Summer 2017. We didn't cool down until almost Thanksgiving. There were many open rider slots. Fees were \$420 per 6-week session. Every rider pays a reduced fee and receives support through donations. There were no sponsored riders this year, and 1 rider received a half-scholarship. Our cost per rider was up due to less riders. Our cost per rider increased from \$67 to \$81per half hour making our actual cost per 6-week session \$486. This year we needed to fund raise about 40% of our rider costs to pay minimum operation expenses. Thanks to the Southern Sassenach's T-Shirt Raffle, we were OK, but were not able to do much catching up for instructor and boarding fees. Since rider fees pay for only the absolute essentials, with less riders than we need, we have fallen short for the last many years causing us to be behind on New River horse board and on salary for our Director and Head Instructor. Increased donations and increased riders must happen. The Hudson's have supported 3 of our horses since September 2016 without full payment for board. Hay was just purchased and horse board costs in Mesa increased this year. Donations to help those expenses will be appreciated. Funding for bareback pads, t-shirts, equipment repairs and vehicle maintenance are not included in rider cost calculations and are totally dependent on donations. If we don't have the money, we cannot buy the equipment needed.

FY17 scheduled 543 half-hour riding lessons - which was about 300 less than last year due to less riders. We could have provided 1460 rides - about 2.5 times that with adequate volunteer support. We provided 484 lessons. There were 56 paid no-shows. Weather was not too bad with only 38 lost rides, which were made up. This summer, 5 riders participated in classes - the same as for last year. Two riders will continue in August. Continuing education for our instructors and volunteers were partially paid for privately. We lost our Cave Creek site in October as the property went up for sale. Fortunately, the riders there were able to ride at different sites. The Hudson's, Craig that is, continues to donate vehicle maintenance. Our classes at Tyler Farms in Mesa, Soft Wind Riding Club in the Peoria/Glendale area will continue.

Volunteers:

71 Registered volunteers with 20 helping out each week. 1,582 Volunteers since 1998. 3,589 hours of volunteer time were given this year. A 20-year total of 114,278 Volunteer hours. Horses gave 213hours this year. 20-year total of 9,360 Horse hours by 56 Horses since 1998.

<u>Horses</u> - In Mesa - Indie, about 19, and Stetson, 20, keep our riders riding and learning. Indie is doing very well keeping our riders safe. She really enjoys playing with us and often meets us at her gate when we get her. Our riders enjoy her quiet movement. We have officially accepted her into our herd, so will be paying full board on her from now on. Stetson, on the other hand, has a big movement and those riders riding him enjoy that. He is learning quickly and will keep his riders on their toes - but he takes care of the riders who need taking care of. Barb, Elaine and Laura help with conditioning our Mesa horses. Dakota - our "baby" is 17, Freckles is 24 and Liber-T is 25, all help in Peoria and New River. Freckles is still my go to for building confidence at trot and canter, although Liber-T is doing well at the trot for our riders. Dakota's nice wide barrel continues to help riders stabilize their core and stretch. Liber-T's speciality is to ask for accuracy - not always what our riders do. But they learn. Horse board is a cost we have monthly no matter how many riders we have. The Equine Dentist is due and that will be about \$600 this year. We have 2 horses in Mesa and 3 in New River. Thank you to the Morris family, The Outlander Private Foundation, the Romo Family and Hudsons for supporting our horses.

This is the time to get the hay we want, but we'll be taking it a bit at a time. First 200 bales have been purchased and delivered. Hay prices are up a couple dollars a bale. The board for New River horses covers hay and grain costs. The

board cost for Mesa covers only hay and went up in May due to increased hay prices and will go up again as we take on Indie completely. Your hay/grain donation will allow us to purchase what we need.

Consider our Adopt a Horse program to support one of our amazing horses. Your donation of \$3,400 will support one of our horses for an entire year. OR \$280/month. Come and ride. Your gift as well as your mileage can be tax deductible..

<u>Facebook and Twitter</u> - each week we post on Facebook and Twitter. "Like", follow and post to our Stable Influence Charity Programs page. Enjoy and share pictures of our riders' successes, as well as noting class changes. Also, just for grins and giggles, watch for sunsets, wild life and other fun stuff happening each week. Add your story and share with your friends, family and folks who may benefit from our services or want to help out. Spread the word - that's our best advertisement. If you ask your followers to donate, to sponsor a rider or horse, or just because, I bet some would. Donations can be given through Pay Pal Giving site by clicking the button on our web site.

Rider Stats: 14 total riders participated in classes this year down from 25 last year. 6 - Autism, 2 - Fetal Alcohol Syndrome, 1 each CP, Brain Tumor, Down Syndrome, DD, Lennox Gausteau, Ohdo. Ages: 1 rider 0-4, 4/6-10,3/11-20, 5/21-30,1/31+.

Our 3 locations continue on. Our horses are trailered from New River to Peoria/Glendale each week. We ask all riders, volunteers and supporters to spread the word to potential riders and volunteers to help us increase participation. Volunteers for Peoria/Glendale are especially sought out. We so appreciate the support of our site owners - Scott, Donna and Wanda at Tyler Farms in Mesa, Maryann at Soft Wind Riding Club in Glendale, and the Hudsons in New River. We are scouting out possible location in Cave Creek - haven't found it yet. But also, need riders and volunteers there to participate.

<u>Horse Show</u> - "Renaissance" was the theme this year. Seven riders participated in classes at our Twentieth Annual Horse Show on April 7. Just over \$2,000 was collected after expenses, which included our Silent Auction (\$416). This was about \$1,500 less than last year's show. Cristina Fauste was again our Show Organizer. She has announced she will retire as Organizer, so we are looking for a new Show Organizer for the 2019 show. Thank you Maryann Hirschberg for letting us show at Soft Wind Riding Club. See the show report in this newsletter.

Staffing - No changes, Chris Hudson continues as the Head Riding Instructor and Executive Director. Barb Bell teaches Thursdays and Summer Mesa classes and coordinates horse care in Mesa. Elaine and Laura assist with horse care. Chris handles the classes on Sunday, Monday and Wednesdays in New River, Mesa and Peoria. Tuesdays, Thursdays, Saturdays and Sundays are available to work horses and for volunteer lessons. Chris does the horse care in New River alone. Cristina helps exercise horses a couple times a month. Come play with me. On a personal note, Chris is scheduling for knee surgery and her class start-up in Peoria this September may be delayed.

<u>Donations</u> - We, of course, thank all of you who donated this past year. We had more new donors - so keep spreading the word and let us increase that number. We were blessed to be recipient of the Southern Sassenach's T-Shirt Raffle which brought in almost \$17,000. We received almost \$20,000 additional in donations this year versus last year thanks to the T-shirt Raffle, Outlander Private Foundation, Human Service Professionals, Morris Family, to name a few. Those numbers are wonderful and we need to keep it going. Finding new donors is always a mission. Thank you to ALL listed in our Donation Section - we truly appreciate your generous gifts.

A group effort by riders, families, volunteers and staff is necessary to keep riders riding. You, our supporters, help us find new sources of funding and bring donations in by sharing our story. There have been at least 10 folks this past year who said they were going to donate - said they had a check from someone for us - or knew a group that had done a fundraiser for us, but those donations never got to us. Those donations would have made a difference.

Our riders' challenges require extra help financially for day-to-day living. Insurance and government programs do not support Equine Assisted Activities. Our riders receive so much benefit, their families struggle to pay for them to ride. I believe that is why each year new riders come to us and previous riders return. It works, and most riders see improvements the very first ride.

<u>Fundraising</u> - Entertainment Book - Lisa and Linda, Katelyn Parmenter's mother and grandmother, again did our Entertainment Book Campaign that brought in \$1,225 - 6 year total \$16,706. They are set up again for this year. Buy one book for yourself. There are so many wonderful discounts. Share and ask people you know to buy a book. A fundraising event we received a windfall from was the Southern Sassenach's wanting to do a T-Shirt Raffle for our benefit. They are a fan club for the Outlander Books and Stars TV Series - "Outlander". When all was finalized, the total was just shy of \$17,000.

This won't happen every year. AWWW - But we can hope. It was a wonderful event. Some fun fundraising ideas - a wine tasting or a painting party. Who can set a simple fundraiser up? Got "Spare Change" - we'll take it. A scholarship fundraiser would be good to support the riders on scholarships. There are several riders who really need to ride and are requesting funding assistance. Little events like a dinner for friends, a t-shirt raffle, a car wash and the continued support of regular donors are appreciated and allow us to keep doing.

Usual fundraising and donations were around \$15,400 - this was an increase of about \$1,400 from last year. Then add the T-Shirt Raffle by the Southern Sassenach's of \$16,945 and we had a total of \$32,370. This is still short of the \$45,000 we received in 2008, but going the right way. We always have to work to get donations up. Fundraising is a critical need in all non-profits. Some grant writing was done in the past and if someone would like to tackle it - thanks. Insurance and repairs were up. We saw a decrease in vet expenses with less horses (Indie and Idol), but that will change as we take Indie's full care on. Most other expenses remained stable. Overall expenses remained stable.

"Poop Bucket Challenge" - for only \$10 - you can help us fill a poop bucket to support our horses. We ask all our Supporters to ask their family and friends to donate to our "Poop Bucket Challenge". Then encourage 5 friends to join in. We would have all we need to support our horses. Taking Indie into our herd will increase our monthly horse care costs, so every little bit will help. Donate through our Pay Pal Giving account or better yet, send your Horse Care gift directly to us and let's fill our bucket up. Craig and I are, personally paying for the care of the horses in New River. Donations from The Outlander Private Donation, Morris Family and Romo Family helped with horse care this year.

100 for \$100 campaign started 6 years ago. To date, only 15 people have donated to this campaign. Let's finish this campaign by each one of you finding just ONE person to gift us \$100. They're out there - just waiting to be asked.

Ask people you know to support us - they can give us \$10 a year - or better yet \$10 every month. Although it doesn't sound like much, I bet we could bridge our costs if everyone plays a part and makes it happen. What do the big foundations say? "For only \$.33 a day!!!" That's only 2 Starbuck's coffees or a pizza in a week. AND if everyone found just one person or company to donate \$100, we would meet our campaign goal. Your request gets us in that door. Often folks ONLY NEED TO BE ASKED. Donations have come from various companies simply because their employees asked. Does your company offer funding or grants? You don't know if you don't ask.

Our fundraising needs each year are: Insurance \$1,200, PATH Membership \$650, Continuing Education for our instructors, \$500, our 5 horses require board, feed, vet and hoof trimming to the tune of \$18,000. Our instructors work more than their small salaries give for their time. Their compensation has not increased since 2000. I personally put over 70 hours a week into the program with teaching, office administration, fund raising and horse care. Barb does way more than teaching 1 afternoon a week. Office and utility expenses never go away. Our Suburban is a 1986 with over 500,000 miles and our 2001 Elantra just turned over 266,000 miles. We have to plan for newer vehicles sometime in the not too distance future. We've been using Hudson's personal dually pick-up truck for classes because having the pick-up bed currently makes more sense. Craig continues to donate time to keep everything running well. Thank you to Barb, Cristina, Elaine, and Laura for helping with the horses.

So that's my story and I'm sticking to it.

Place tortilla on a large plate, cover with peanut butter. On half, place strawberries, coconut, banana, almonds ???? Fold in half Cut in wedges. Enjoy.

You can put anything you like on it. You can also heat it up using a very hot skillet. Heat up 1 side for a minute or 2 and flip to heat the other side. Tortilla should be browned, but not hard - filling just warm.
