A Mother's Story of Volunteering By Smitha Saridharan

On a bright and crisp morning, Saanvi and I drove to a serene farm nestled at the edge of New River. We had heard about Stable Influence program and extraordinary horses who had a magical way of connecting with people and helping them realize their real potential. Curious and excited, Saanvi had insisted we visit, her eyes lighting up at the idea of spending a day with the horses.

As we arrived, all the horses were walking around in the pen. Chris greeted us warmly and introduced us to them. "This is Liber-T," she said, gesturing to a tall, majestic bay horse with a mane that shimmered in the sunlight. "And this is Dakota," she added, pointing to a gentle brown paint mare with the softest eyes. Both horses have been with Chris for a long time.

Saanvi stepped forward, her usual shyness melting away. As she approached Liber-T her eyes filled with curiosity. She smiled as she nudged her hand with her velvety nose. Meanwhile, Dakota calmly stood by, as if waiting for her turn. "They're so friendly, Mom," Saanvi said, her voice filled with wonder.

Chris invited Saanvi to help groom the horses. Armed with a brush, she carefully ran it over Dakota's smooth coat. Liber-T, not one to be left out, playfully nudged her shoulder, making her laugh. "Okay, okay, you're next!" she said, brushing Liber-T's mane with equal attention.

Later, we walked with the horses along a winding trail. Chris told us stories about the people they had helped with, a 7-year old with Cerebral Palsy, a 75-year old with Stroke and many more of such nature. Saanvi listened intently, her small hand resting on Liber-T's strong neck. "It's like they understand people and know how to help them" she said thoughtfully. As the day went on, something shifted in both of us. Watching Saanvi interact with the horses—her gentle pats, the way she spoke to them softly—it was clear that these animals had an almost magical ability to bring out empathy and calmness. Saanvi noticed every little thing about them—the way Dakota's ears twitched when she was curious, or how Liber-T takes care of riders – she thinks she knows how to take care of them better than anyone else. "They're like friends who don't need words," she said.

By the end of the visit, we both felt lighter, more connected not just to the horses but to each other and the world around us. Saanvi hugged Liber-T tightly and whispered, "Thank you for being so kind." She seemed to understand, nuzzling her gently in return.

Driving home, Saanvi said, "I think spending time with them makes you see how everyone, even animals, have feelings and stories." I smiled, realizing how true her words were. The day with Liber-T and Dakota had taught us not just to care for others but to truly listen and empathize. In their quiet way, the horses had given us a gift—an open heart and a deeper understanding of kindness.

It was a day we would never forget, one that brought us closer to nature, to each other, and to the essence of what it means to be human.

KIDS COOKING SPIRIT'S FRUIT PIZZA

roll (16.5 oz) refrigerated Pillsbury[™] Sugar Cookie Dough
package (8 oz) cream cheese, softened or Flavored Cream Cheese
1/3 cup sugar
1/2 teaspoon vanilla - or 1/4 t Almond or Rum Extract

2 Kiwifruit, peeled, halved lengthwise and sliced1 cup halved or quartered fresh strawberries1 cup fresh or frozen blueberries1/2 cup apple jelly

Heat oven to 350°F. Spray 12-inch pizza pan with cooking spray. Break up cookie dough in pan; press dough evenly in bottom of pan to within 1/2 inch of edge. Bake 16 to 20 minutes or until golden brown. Cool completely on cooling rack, about 30 minutes.

In small bowl, beat cream cheese, sugar and vanilla with electric mixer on medium speed until fluffy. Spread mixture over cooled crust.

Arrange fruit over cream cheese. Stir jelly until smooth; spoon or brush over fruit. Refrigerate until chilled, at least 1 hour. To serve, cut into wedges or squares. Cover and refrigerate any remaining pizza.

STATE OF THE STABLE

We sincerely send a big THANK YOU to everyone who has supported us this past year. Here's hoping all of you have a wonderful holiday season and are looking forward to a safe and prosperous 2024.

We were once again challenged with rain and wind in the spring and very - did I say VERY - high heat this summer and even into the early fall. We thought summer 2023 was hot, but once again the candle melted with the heat during Summer and early fall 2024. We did have 4 riders participate and ride through August in New River. We had a few hot days, but were sad and surprised when it continued into September and even into October.

Our 27th ride year began In September and with the heat it was a slow start. We had many calls for riders to start, throughout the year, but although they made appointments to come, they didn't. The few riders who didn't ride this summer were eager to get back to riding and the riders who braved the summer heat, continued. It was a small start with only 5 riders in Peoria and 4 more in New River. Four of our long time riders moved out of town and another "graduated" to do other things like, join choir and study martial arts. She was unable to do these things when she started with us. Although we'll miss her smiling face, we are very happy she is thriving. I also believe the very high heat we experienced into October put some folks off to starting an outside activity. We continue to have a few riders and volunteers who come to New River from the east valley, so do think we are doing something right. We held classes in Peoria on Wednesday afternoons until the first of December and in New River Saturday mornings. Effective December 1, all classes will be held in New River and we will no longer be riding at Peoria.

Riders come to us for many reasons and we try to make each lesson challenging so they can be successful in achieving their goals - to improve balance and coordination, to improve focus, to work on fine and gross motor functions, to help with speech and others ride just because they enjoy the movement the horse gives them. That's one I certainly get as I often just hop on to get a quiet ride and enjoy the movement which helps keep me in alignment and more flexible. At my age, I take all the help I can. Everyone can have benefit whether you are "challenged" (and who doesn't have something to work on) or not. Riders start their lesson by playing - and yes it should be fun - with their horse "on-line", meaning they are on the ground and use their energy, their bodies and a lead line for connection and communication with their horse. This helps truly connection with their horse and it's obvious that the horses look forward to their rider's interaction. "On-Line" play helps our riders with coordination, balance, focus, fine and gross motor skills, planning and even how better to work with their energy. Cool things are getting accomplished like - side passing along a fence or over a ground pole, circling, having their horse put a particular foot in a hula hoop, touching a target with their nose, weaving cones or stepping up on a tire pedestal. Riders learn when to be quiet and when to ask with a bit more authority. Riders attending from first of the year, Caydon, Elizabeth, Julia, Jurgen, Irish, Noah, Oliver, Rhett and even Ruth improved or are learning on-line skills. Ruth simply loved asking Liber-T to back up by doing yo-yo and wiggling the lead line. Liber-T loves the kiddos and she stepped back with enthusiasm. Liber-T doesn't step back that easily for anyone but our kiddos - she so

loves playing with the little ones. Some riders, Natalie, Phillip and Woodrow only ride, which helps them improve or maintain their balance, coordination and focus - they all enjoy their time with the horses so much.

Officers - Our officers, Chris, Craig, and Kathy keep everything running smoothly. Thank you for your service.

<u>Staff</u> - Instructors, Chris is still our only instructor and also is the responsible to work horses 3 or 4 days a week along with daily chores of cleaning pens and feeding. Craig has been helping with the chores - thank you !

Horses - With temperatures at record highs this summer, once again, all the horses had forced time off. I couldn't get them hot with exercise - and rising temps would not let them cool down afterwards. Finally, temps are at a point I can work to get them back into shape. Gracie, 11, is learning. She came to us basically untrained, but is very gentle. I have done extensive ground work with her. Several of our volunteers have ridden her, but that's only been 40 times and it's been very spotty. I have been on her about 7 times and now that we are finally having lower temperatures, should be able to ride more regularly. Spirit, who joined our herd in early August, is 22 and my farrier is doing a great job getting her feet better balanced and proper angles. She is learning the ground work and we should be able to start riding her soon. I think she'll be a good fit as she's narrower than Gracie or Dakota and looks like she gives a nice smooth walk. Dakota is, 23 now, her very quite movement and nice wide back gives those needing support, the movement and broad support they require. Dakota will respond nicely to a rider who is attentive and focused. Liber-T, 31 now, is still helping riders "do it right". She is the best for deciding when riders are ready and responds to exactly what they are asking - even though that may not be what the rider is wanting. She is very patient as a rider starts to learn, but as the rider becomes more skilled, she asks for more precision. So we are teaching her what we can on line as she improves each day. She has all the right requirements to be a great therapy horse - soon. Horse upkeep costs have remained stabled with 4 horses to feed. I was able to get hay in for the year and prices have dropped a bit from last year. Economy increasing plays a big role, of course, and hay is about 60% more than just 3 years ago. Monthly costs for our horses, no matter how many riders we have, never ends - the Equine Dentist's is due (about \$400), they get grain and supplements and every 7 weeks get their feet trimmed. We care for 3 horses and the Hudsons support Liber-T.

Program - Our spring 2024 was challenging with rain and wind causing adjustments in riding schedules. Additionally, our volunteer staffing has fallen short the last 2 years and we've had to cancel classes at times because we did not have enough volunteers to be safe. In September, when we started up in Peoria on Wednesdays 4 people said they'd come to help, but on the day, only 1 came. I'm not sure what the trend is, but it makes scheduling very difficult. I am grateful Craig has been available to help and our riders have been so flexible. We are slowly catching up for horse board and instructor salary. Meeting our basic costs is happening and but have very little reserve. New riders join us each year, as others achieve their goals and move on to new activities. Our basic costs usually remain pretty stable. HA HA HA. Horses cost - - what horses cost. Horse care costs have remained fairly level. I put funds aside for hay (hay fundraiser \$25 for a bale) for what I expect costs will be next year. If there are not enough rider fees to cover the costs, more donations are needed to fill the gap. The horses need to eat - every day - whether there are riders or not. We give a discounted fee for all riders who pay in advance for the lesson block which mirrors what anyone would pay for a riding lesson. We strive to receive donations to bridge our expenses. We currently have no riders receiving scholarship money. No riders are being sponsored. Potential new riders are excited to start until they find out there are fees. I am very careful to see that riders are serious when offering scholarships. We cannot serve them without donations for scholarships or sponsorships. Fundraising and donations keep fees down for riders and hopefully, will cover the difference. Our classes at Soft Wind Riding Club went well through the end of November. All classes will continue at Stable Influence and are going well. Effective December 1, all classes will be held at Stable Influence in New River. Thank you MaryAnn and the Hudsons. And, of course, Craig, for your help and support this past year

To keep everyone informed of our activities, I post on Facebook every Saturday. Riders enjoy highlights of their fun. I add fun pictures and news - just for grins and giggles. Share your stories and information with everyone you know and ask for support. #Giving Tuesday and our status as an AZ Qualified Charitable Organization can benefit both us and donors. The best way to spread the word is by word of mouth or sharing on social media of how our riders are minimizing their challenges by riding in our program. Jot a message and share your story for everyone to enjoy. People don't know of the miracles you have seen our riders achieve unless you share stories.
