1 - 5.3 ounce container whole milk vanilla greek yogurt 1/3 cup fresh raspberries or blueberries - or strawberries or ???

STATE OF THE STABLE

Our 23rd year was full of challenges and successes. A BIG THANK YOU to everyone who has supported us by volunteering, making donations or bringing us riders and volunteers. We so appreciate all your support which has made Stable Influence Charity Programs the successful Equine Assisted Activities and Therapy program it is.

In August 2020 we welcomed 2 new riders to our family. More riders joined in over the next few months. We were careful with Covid guidelines and, of course, we play outside. Our families were so grateful to have a weekly activity since so many clinics and events were closed or canceled. All our riders made good progress toward their goals and those that achieved their goals got new ones to work toward. AHHH - it just gets better and better. We have improved the lives of over 463 riders since 1998. Some have been riding with us from the beginning. WOW !!

Program - For FY20 August riding was very spotty with exceptional high heat, but in September, Session 1 started out with 15 half-hour riding lessons scheduled each week and we welcomed 4 new riders. This was only 2 less than in FY19 and with Covid we felt pretty good. By spring, we were up to 20 half-hour rides per week. Several new riders were in process to begin riding which would have given us a big increase in riders - had all the planets aligned in our favor. However, in mid-February, just as we were going to start Session 4, tragedy struck. One of our rider's aides wrote an e-mail to our wonderful Mesa ride site hosts expressing her feelings about how she felt the horses were being treated at the stable. This is a premier stable that breeds world class, award winning horses. The stables and horses are immaculately kept. We were extremely grateful for their support of our program since August 2019. This person admitted she didn't know anything about horses, much less about how to keep very expensive stallions, mares and foals safely. Her 1 time, 1 hour visit caused the stable to close to all outside people. So February 22, we moved our 2 horses, our shed and ramp to New River. This ended almost 30 years of me providing therapeutic riding for people in the East Valley. It was very sad for the 14 riders we served and all the volunteers who gave their time, many for years, to help our riders. Our Peoria/Glendale site is still working well with 9 riders at the time. Thankfully, 4 of our Mesa riders and several volunteers decided to make the trip Saturday mornings from Mesa to New River to continue riding and helping. We are currently not seeking another site in the East Valley since we exhausted all possibilities 2years ago. We will continue working at our Peoria/Glendale and New River sites.

With a lot of being very careful, support for horses in Mesa until February and more riders participating this year, we actually reduced our cost per rider per 6-week session. However, loss of our Mesa site has increased our horse care costs with 2 extra horses in New River, so costs will increase going forward. Every rider pays a reduced fee for riding. We bridge the difference with donations. One rider received a half-scholarship thanks to the Lisa Wintermantel Memorial Ridership Award. We had about 6 calls for new riders in the East Valley after the site closed. Had we been able to add those riders we would have been in really good shape. We'll see what next year brings.

As it stands now, with known increase in horse care costs and loss of riders in Mesa, I estimate we will need to fund raise about 55% of our rider costs to pay minimum operation expenses. Rider fees are calculated to pay for only the absolute essentials. Less riders cause us to continue to fall short for horse care costs and Head Instructor salary. We are looking forward to a good beginning in September. Some of our riders have been with us since before the beginning and we appreciate their continued support. Even with the summer heat, we started 1 new rider this summer. Our riders have various goals. Some come and stay, but others are seeking a specific goal and once reached - it's time for them to "ride away". The Hudson's have supported 3 and since February 4, of our horses since January 2018 without full payment for board. Hay is purchased each summer. A few riders always ask for sponsorship funding. We hope we can help a few more riders with partial class fees. If you'd like to sponsor a rider, contact us to make a donation. Donations for expenses are always appreciated. Funding for a new car, bareback pads, equipment repairs, vehicle maintenance and program t-shirts, are not included in rider cost calculations and are totally dependent on donations.

FY20 scheduled 590 half-hour riding lessons - which was only 44 less than last year. Had we not lost Mesa, we'd have had 130 more. With adequate volunteer support, we could have scheduled another 75 rides. We provided 526 lessons this year compared to 436 last year. We made up 71 missed rides and had 57 no-shows. Weather was not as bad as last year with 68 lost rides due to heat and rain. However, we lost 122 rides, due to Covid-19. For summer, 6 riders participated in classes in New River. This was 4 more than last year. In August, we'll have 5 riders continue, providing the heat isn't too bad. Continuing education for our instructors and volunteers were partially paid for privately. Craig, thank goodness, continues to donate vehicle, shed and ramp maintenance. Our classes Wednesdays at Soft Wind Riding Club in Peoria/Glendale will begin again mid-September. We will also ride Saturday mornings in New River. YEAH!

Volunteers: 69 Registered volunteers with 15 helping out each week. 1,687 Volunteers since 1998.
3,138 hours of volunteer time were given this year. 113,526. Volunteer hours since 1998.
Horses gave 263 hours this year. 10,129 Horse hours by 60 Horses since 1998.

Horses - Our new horse, Afire Krewe is now 21. He was able to help many of our riders while in Mesa and is still receiving necessary retraining to a better mount for our riders. Thank you to Jay who has done an amazing job. Afire is smaller than our other horses so offers a more narrow barrel for our riders. He does, however, offer good, active movement, which is very nice for our riders who need that. Stetson at 23 and Liber-T at 28, are both wider and offer great movement for riders needing to work their core. Stetson is settling more and more each year. Angela, Elaine and Jay helped with conditioning Stetson and Afire when in Mesa. Now that they are in New River, it's up to me. Liber-T loves our littlest riders and it's fun to see her look for them and snuggle when she gets a chance. However, when being ridden, she wants it done "right", which really challenges our more advanced riders. Our "baby", Dakota is now 20. She offers riders a very wide back, but quiet movement. So different than Liber-T and Stetson. Freckles is 27 now and has movement between what Liber-T and Dakota offer. She has quiet movement, but surely can go if asked. Her narrow barrel is great for riders needing less of a stretch. She is often my first choice for new riders. I am pretty much on my own to maintain the horses, and with 2 extra here, it is a challenge getting them all exercised. Horse board is a cost we have monthly no matter how many riders we have and this year we have 2 extra horses to feed. The Equine Dentist is due in December for about \$500 this year. I am very grateful to her for helping our horses a couple times during the year. Thank you to the Morris family, The Outlander Private Foundation, Royal Arabians and the Hudson's for supporting our horses this past year.

We had to purchase additional hay this summer as Afire and Stetson have joined the herd. End of summer we will purchase for the year. I expect hay prices to be up a bit. The board for horses covers hay and grain costs. Your hay/grain donation will allow us to purchase what we need to keep all the horses fat and sassy - well not too sassy.

You can help out with our Adopt a Horse program to support one of our amazing horses. Your donation of \$250/month or \$2,900 per year will support one of our horses. Your gift as well as your mileage can be tax deductible. Thank you to Morris Family and Hudsons for your horse support.

About 3% is taken out for fees. We accept Zelle for donations to our e-mail - stableinfl@aol.com. Or - - - just send us a check directly or through your bank bill-pay.

Rider Stats: A total of 30 riders participated in classes this year which was up from 24 last year. 9 - Autism, 4 - CP, 3 - Down Syndrome, 2 - ADHD,, 2 - Fetal Alcohol Syndrom, 2 Foster, 2 Speech, 1 each Lennox Gausteau, Low Tone, MS, Schizophrenia, Sensory Processing, TBI. However, most all of our riders have multiple challenges. Rider ages: 0-5 3, 6-10 9, 11-20 11, 21-30 4, 31-59 2, 60+ 1.

We rode in 3 locations this year. On Monday and Thursday at Royal Arabians in Mesa until mid-February. On Wednesdays in Glendale, our horses were trailered from New River each week during the school year. After Mesa closed, 4 riders came to New River on Saturday mornings until the end of May and then we had summer classes on Wednesdays during June and July where riders enjoyed fun on "real" trail rides. We ask all riders, volunteers and supporters to spread the word to potential riders and volunteers to help us increase participation. We had wonderful participation of volunteers this past year and are thankful to everyone who helped out. We so appreciate the support of our site owners - Maryann at Soft Wind Riding Club in Glendale, the Hudsons in New River and Amanda at Royal Arabians in Mesa.

Horse Show - Unfortunately our horse show this year was once again canceled due to Covid-19.

Staffing - Chris Hudson continues as the Head Riding Instructor and Executive Director. Angela, Elaine and Jay assisted with horse care. Chris handles all the classes at both sites Wednesdays and Saturdays. Sundays are available to work horses and for volunteer lessons. Chris does the horse care for all horses. Come play with our horses and improve your skills.

Donations - We always want to thank all of you who donated this past year. We met new donors and appreciate supporters who help every year. Keep spreading the word and let us increase our donor roster. We received donations from Boeing ECF, Phillip Cocklin, Morris Family, Angela Pruitt, The Outlander Private Foundation, Smith Family, the Lisa Wintermantel Memorial Ridership Award and the Paul Youngmark Memorial, to name a few. Of course, new donors are always welcomed. Thank you to ALL listed in our Donation Section - we truly appreciate your generous gifts.

The challenges our riders have require extra financing just for day-to-day living. Insurance and government programs do not support Equine Assisted Activities. Our riders receive so much benefit, their families will struggle to pay for them to ride. Those that rode this past year were very grateful we were able to stay open as so many activities and therapy clinics were shut down. Being consistent is why I believe each year new riders come to us and previous riders return. We have riders who have

been with us for over 20 years and some I've worked with for over 30 years. It works. Most riders see improvements the very first ride.

Fundraising - Our horse show is our big fundraiser each year, but has not been possible for the past 2 years. We obtained approval as an Arizona Qualifying Charitable Organization this year. Which means, donors in 2021 can use QCO Code 22306 and get a dollar for dollar return on AZ State Taxes. Up to \$400 for a single person and \$800 for a couple is given. Other ideas could be - a wine tasting or a painting party. Anyone can set up a simple fundraiser. Got "Spare Change" - we'll take it. A scholarship fundraiser would be good to support the riders on scholarships. Several riders ask for funding assistance each year. Little events like a dinner with friends, a t-shirt raffle or a car wash can really help. We appreciate the continued support of regular donors and know they are appreciated to allow us to keep doing.

Usual fundraising and donations were around \$15,034 which was a smidge more than last year, but \$4,000 shy of FY2018. We continue to work to get donations up. Fundraising is a critical need for all non-profits. I wrote 1 grant request, but was denied. If someone would like to tackle it - thanks.

Insurance and repair expenses were up. Other than horse costs, expenses remained pretty stable.

New Car Fundraiser. The Elantra has to retire and we need to raise funds for a new car. Our 2001 Elantra has 307,000 miles on it and repairs will cost more than its value. Please - if you can - help us raise \$26,000 to purchase a new vehicle.

"Poop Bucket Challenge" - asking for a \$10 donation is still out there. We are trying to fill a poop bucket with \$10 bills to support our horses. Encourage 5 friends to join in - - and - they ask 5 friends - - - and so on for success. It would give us all we need to support our horses. Donate through Zelle, our Pay Pal Donor Button or better yet, send your Horse Care gift directly to us. Let's fill our bucket up. In 2012 we started the 100 for \$100 campaign. It's still out there - unfinished, but getting closer. Let's finish this campaign by each one of you finding just ONE person to gift us \$100. They're waiting to be asked.

Craig and I have personally covered the costs for the New River horses since February 2018. Donations from The Outlander Private Foundation, Hudson Family, Morris Family and Royal Arabians helped with horse care this year.

Ask people you know to support us with only \$10 a year - or better yet \$10 every month. Although it doesn't sound like much, I bet we could bridge our costs if everyone plays a part and makes it happen. What do the big foundations say? "For only \$.33 a day!!!" That's only 2 Starbucks coffees or a pizza in a week. AND if everyone found just one person or company to donate \$100, we would meet our campaign goal. Your request gets us in that door. Often folks ONLY NEED TO BE ASKED. Donations have come from various companies simply because their employees asked. Does your company offer funding or grants? You don't know if you don't ask.

Our fundraising needs each year are: Insurance \$1,200, PATH Membership \$650, Continuing Education for our instructors, \$500, our 6 horses require board, feed, vet and hoof trimming to the tune of around \$18,000. Our instructor works more than her small salary gives for her time. Instructor compensation has not increased since 2000. I personally put over 70 hours a week into the program with teaching, office administration, fund raising and horse care. Office and utility expenses never go away. Our Suburban is a 1986 with over 500,000 miles. Our 2001 Elantra just turned over 307,000 miles and we must replace it with a newer vehicle as repair costs are more than its value. We've set up a Car Fundraiser to raise money for a new vehicle. We've been using Hudson's personal dually pick-up truck for classes because having the pick-up bed currently makes more sense. Craig continues to donate time to keep everything running well. Thank you to Angela, Elaine and Jay for helping with the horses.
