STATE OF THE STABLE

Wow - Stable Influence has been helping folks for 26 years since we started in August of 1998. Thank you to everyone who helped us out this past year by volunteering, making donations or bringing us riders and volunteers. Thank you to our riders who make all of this possible. Stable Influence Charity Programs is the successful Equine Assisted Activities and Therapy program it is because of all of your support.

Program - At the beginning of our fiscal year, August 2023, 3 riders chose to ride for our Summer Session. Then, in September we started up with 10 riders in our 2 locations - 2 less than last year. We added a few more riders throughout the year with a final count of 12 each week. Although that seems small, we are only riding in 2 locations. Since we started our program in August 1998 we have improved the lives of over 475 riders. Heat was the challenge again this summer. Some rain in the winter and spring, but the biggest challenge this year was lack of volunteers. We are looking forward to offering riding in September at both our Peoria/Glendale site on Wednesdays and our New River site on Saturdays. But we need volunteers to help out or we just cannot make it happen.

Throughout the year, we got donations for hay. We'll be purchasing hay again late summer, which is typically when prices are lowest. Purchasing hay for the year ensures we get consistent quality to feed our amazing therapy horses. AND - we only have to fuss with it one time a year. At this writing, I haven't checked out hay prices, but believe costs have gone down a bit.

Rider fees remained the same this past year and will going forward. We figure in only the absolute essentials to figure rider fees. When we have fewer riders and expenses increase, we fall short for horse care, insurance and Head Instructor salary. Riders seek us out for many reasons. Some have specific goals, and once reached, they move on. Others enjoy riding and continue, as it is good exercise. Often, we get a few riders who will ask for sponsorship funding and hope we can help a few more riders with partial class fees if sponsorship funding is available. We are getting closer to paying for the new car which was financed, bareback pads, equipment repairs, vehicle maintenance and program t-shirts, are not included in rider cost calculations and are totally dependent on donations.

FY23 scheduled 527 half-hour riding lessons - which was 165 more than last year. We provided 401 lessons this year compared to 264 last year. Our schedule was full. We made up 47 missed rides. There were 71 no-shows from rider cancellations. There were 62 weather related and 28 "other" related lost rides which were mainly due to no volunteers support on class day. As usual, heat, rain and wind caused most of our canceled classes. For summer, 4 riders participated in classes in New River. Two 2 rode for 45 minutes each. In August 2024, we have 4 riders continuing to ride, providing the heat isn't too bad. Continuing education for our instructors and volunteers paid for privately. Craig, thank goodness, continues to donate vehicle, shed and ramp maintenance and this year helped each week at our Wednesday classes. Thank you to Craig, Nick, Colton, Matt, Jennifer, Jordan and Dylan for helping with maintenance and horse pen repair. Our classes Wednesdays at Soft Wind Riding Club in Peoria/Glendale will begin again mid-September and will ride Saturday mornings in New River.

Volunteers: 8 registered volunteers, 4 helping out each week, 46 short term. 1,893 Volunteers since 1998.
3,135 hours of volunteer time were given this year. 132,822 Volunteer hours since 1998.
Horses gave 206 hours this year. 10,626 Horse hours by 61 Horses since 1998.

Having enough volunteers to do class is a big challenge right now. Of the 46 short term volunteers who came out only a few times, most never said they would not return. They said "This was great, see you next week", but didn't show or respond to calls. We do things with our program a bit differently than you would otherwise playing with horses. It requires training by me and more experienced volunteers. That takes time away from other things we could - should - be doing. Much time is lost by having to train folks who only stay a couple of weeks. Then have to do it again with new folks. The first few times someone comes out they are learning the "ropes" so to speak. It can be confusing and can feel like they are not truly helping. But, after a bit, when they feel more comfortable with grooming, tacking up, playing with the horses on line and mounted - then working with the riders, they understand and feel more comfortable. Only a couple of weeks learning doesn't allow enough time to get in the swing. So, this next year, I truly hope this trend ends and we get folks who will stay and help us.

Horses - Our herd remained - ha ha ha - stable this past year until the very last week. Gracie, our horse in training, is 12 and doing well with her training. Challenges have been with consistency in playing with her due to time (mine) and summer heat. Thank you Cristina and Jason for helping out here and there. But, she's at a point now I don't feel I'll have to jump off (can't do it due to knee replacements), so I've been able to get on her several times for some focused work. Liber-T is 31 now. She still loves helping with her riders. Because her movement is more active, we've been able to move several riders to her to further their skills. She is most helpful for riders who need to experience movement.. She looks forward to having the little ones ride and gives them cuddles. She is so very careful as they learn to lead her around a 3 year old led her from the arena to the horse pens a few months ago. As she works with more advanced riders, she still wants it done "right", which makes her a great teacher for both riders and volunteers. Dakota at 24 offers riders opportunities to learn to regulate their energy

as she is more responsive than Liber-T or Freckles. Her very wide back and quiet movement offers riders a lot of support, but not so much movement. This is important for riders who are needing to improve muscle tone due to a weak trunk. Later, they get to experience the active movement Liber-T offers. On a sad note - Freckles was 30 and "graduated" to the Rainbow Bridge in Horseman's Heaven. She was wonderful almost to the end giving Natalie a great ride 4 days before she "graduated". Her movement was less than Liber-T and more than what Dakota offers. Her shorter striding, but quieter movement than Liber-T challenged riders, but not too much. Her more narrow barrel is great for riders needing less of a stretch. She suffered from sidewinder syndrome, which came on in about 4 hours. This causes the horse to swing their hips to the side challenging their balance. Old horses who have arthritis are prone to this. It was very fast with no good outcome. We said "goodbye".

BUT then - the very next week we got a call about a 20 year old mare looking for a good home. We headed to Gold Canyon (76 miles 1 way) on Sunday the 11th and met Spirit. It was very hot, so I didn't ride her, but she did well with the ground work we asked her to do. She's a beautiful chestnut with a very long mane and tail. Looking forward to getting to know her.

Horse board is a cost we have monthly no matter how many riders we have. This year we had 4 horses to support and will support 4 for next year. We are behind on board, but slowly catching up. Thank you to the Hudson's who have covered the costs as we get caught up on horse board. The Equine Dentist comes every December for about \$400 this year. I am very grateful to him for helping our horses a couple times during the year. We are catching up on horse board and are thankful to the Hudson's for supporting our horses this past year.

It's the end of summer and we will again have to purchase hay for the year. Not sure what hay costs are right now. I think there has been a slight decrease from last year. But, we do need to purchase some to make it through the year, So our Hay Fundraiser is ongoing and we do ask everyone to help by purchasing just 1 bale of hay for \$20. Board for horses covers hay and grain costs. It does not cover the cost for hoof trimming every 7 weeks for \$150, vet work or the equine dentist. Please consider making a donation to help purchase hay and grain to keep all the horses fat and sassy - well not too sassy.

Adopt a Horse program is available to help support one of our amazing horses. Your donation of \$300/month or \$3,600 per year will totally support one of our horses. Your gift, of course, is tax deductible.

Facebook - keep up on what our riders are doing when we post each Saturday. "Like", "Follow" and post to our Stable Influence Charity Programs page. Enjoy and share pictures of our riders' successes. Also, just for grins and giggles, watch for sunsets, wild life and other fun stuff happening each week. Add a story, share with your friends, family and folks who may benefit from our services or who may want to help out. Spread the word - that's our best advertisement. Ask your FB followers to donate, to sponsor a rider or horse, or just because, I bet some would buy a bale of hay if asked. Donations can be given through Pay Pal by clicking the Donate button on our web site. But note - donations through PayPal, about 3% is taken out for fees. We accept Zelle for donations to our e-mail - stableinfl@aol.com. Or - - - just send us a check directly or through your bank bill-pay.

Rider Stats: We helped 14 riders in classes this year which was 1 more than last year. 6 - Autism, 3 - Down Syndrome, 1 each Fetal Alcohol Syndrome, Lennox Gausseau, Niemann Pick Type C, However, most all of our riders have multiple challenges. Rider ages: under 5 - 3, 6-10 2, 11-20 2, 21-30 3, 31-59 2.

We rode in 2 locations last year. We trailer our horses from New River each week to our Peoria/Glendale on Wednesdays September-May. We also ride in New River on Saturday mornings. Summer classes are in New River on Tuesdays during June, July and August. We lost rides due to lack of volunteers, some from rain/wind and summer heat. Trail rides and a big sand hill in New River offers opportunities for riders to do trail rides to practice what they learned in the arena. Please, everyone, spread the word to potential riders and volunteers to help us increase participation. Volunteer participation this past year was very spotty and we had to cancel class at times due to not enough help to make it safe. We are, of course, very thankful to everyone who helped out. Lack of volunteers was a challenge, but mostly we made it work. We so appreciate the support of our site owners - Maryann at Soft Wind Riding Club in Glendale, the Hudson's in New River.

Staffing - Chris Hudson continues as the Head Riding Instructor, Executive Director and wearer of all hats. Chris is our Program Board President, Craig is our Secretary/Treasurer and Kathy Wilke is our Vice President. Chris supervises all the classes at both sites Wednesdays and Saturdays. Mornings and Sundays are available to work horses and for volunteer lessons. Chris does the horse care and exercising for all horses, with Craig's help this past year. Come play with our horses and improve your skills. Riding lessons are available by appointment to our volunteers.

Donations - We thank all of you who donated this past year. In December we had a wonderful surprise from Diane Zucco who gave us a \$20,000 donation. WOW. We couldn't believe it and were able to put it to very good use in all areas. We had a some new donors join us and appreciate supporters who have been helping every year. By our supporters spreading the word we can increase our donor roster. In addition to Diane Zucco's fabulous donation, we received donations from Ahlman Family, American Family Insurance, Malena Family, Abby Masterson and the Smith Family, just to name a few. As a non-profit, we are always seeking new donors. Thank you to ALL listed in our Donation Section - we truly appreciate your generous gifts.

Our riders face extra financing challenges just for day-to-day living. Insurance and government programs do not support Equine Assisted Activities. The benefit our riders receive is so appreciated, their families will struggle to pay for them to ride. Being consistent is why I believe new riders come to us each year and previous riders return. We must be doing something right as some of our riders have been with us for over 20 years. One I've worked with for 37 years. It works. Most riders see improvements the very first ride.

Fundraising - As a non-profit, fund raising is an "always" project needed to bridge the difference between what it costs to operate our program and what our riders pay for services. If the funding isn't available, we don't buy it. We have always been very careful with spending. Total operating costs are not covered by our rider fees and riders pay a reduced fee for riding. There are a few riders, however, who choose to pay the full cost for their riding and we are very grateful for their support and confidence. Donations must bridge the difference. We have some sponsorship funding available. This past year we didn't have any riders requesting scholarship assistance through the Lisa Wintermantel Memorial Ridership Award. Two of our riders and 3 volunteers travel from Mesa, others come from Surprise and even Buckeye each week to ride and/or help with our riders. So, although we do not have East Valley or Southwest Valley locations, we do continue to get calls for riding.

We are approved as an Arizona Qualifying Charitable Organization for 2024. Donations made to us can result in a dollar for dollar reduction on your AZ State Tax return. Use QCO Code 22306 on Form 321 for that tax dollar reduction on your AZ State Taxes. Up to \$421 for a single person and \$841 for a couple is available. We also have our "Buy a Bale of Hay" Fundraiser ongoing. Some fundraising ideas could be - a wine tasting or a painting party. Anyone can set up a simple fundraiser. Got "Spare Change" - we'll take it. A scholarship fundraiser would be good to support the riders on scholarships. Usually, several riders ask for funding assistance each year. Little events like a dinner with friends, a t-shirt raffle or a car wash can really help. We appreciate the continued support of regular donors and know they are appreciated to allow us to keep doing.

Fundraising and donations brought in \$31,870. Taking the windfall \$20,000 out, realized \$11,870 in donations which was about \$1,000 more than last year. We must keep asking for donations to keep everything working well. Working to secure donations is a constant challenge. Fundraising is a critical need for all non-profits.

Insurance and repair expenses were stable. With the increase in hay costs, our expenses increased in horse costs, other expenses inched up, but remained pretty stable.

New Car Fundraiser. Since the Elantra is now officially retired at 311,000 miles. We had to finance a new car and chose a KIA Soul. We are seeking donations to pay for it and set a goal of \$26,000. We have \$8,100 yet to go.

"Poop Bucket Challenge" - "Buy a Bale of Hay" - You can ask folks you know for a \$10 donation to fill a poop bucket with \$10 bills to support our horses. Or \$25 to purchase a bale of hay. If you encourage 5 friends to join in - - and - they ask 5 friends - - and so on we could make it happen. This would give us all we need to support our horses. Donate through Zelle, our Pay Pal Donor Button or better yet, send your Horse Care gift directly to us. Let's fill our bucket up. Thank you to those who donated to our Buy a Bale of Hay fundraiser. It's a start. In 2012 we started the 100 for \$100 campaign. It's still out there - unfinished, but getting closer. Let's finish this campaign by every one please finding just ONE person to gift us \$100. They're just waiting to be asked.

Ask people you know to support us with only \$10 - or better yet \$10 every month. Although it doesn't sound like much, I bet we could bridge our costs if everyone plays a part and makes it happen. What do the big foundations say? "For only \$.33 a day !!!" That's only 1 Starbucks coffee in a week, a bale of hay costs the same as 1 pizza. AND if everyone found just one person or company to donate \$100, we would meet our campaign goal. Your request gets us in that door. Often folks ONLY NEED TO BE ASKED. Donations have come from various companies simply because their employees asked. Does your company offer funding or grants? You don't know if you don't ask.

Craig and I have personally covered the costs for the New River horses since January 2020. We are caught up to 7-2023.

Our usual fundraising needs each year are: Insurance \$1,000, PATH Membership \$650, Continuing Education for our instructor, \$500, our 4 horses require board, feed, vet and hoof trimming to the tune of around \$14,000. Our instructor works more than the small salary gives for her time. Instructor compensation has not increased since 2000, in fact we have dropped her compensation since our Mesa location closed. She puts over 50 hours a week into the program with teaching, office administration, fundraising, horse care and exercise. Office and utility expenses never go away. Our Suburban is a 1986 with over 500,000 miles. We have \$8,100 remaining to pay off the new car. We've been using Hudson's personal dually pick-up truck for classes because having the pick-up bed currently makes more sense than using the Suburban. Craig continues to donate time to keep everything running well..



AND - - - that's my story and I'm sticking to it.
