<u>Selection Criteria for the Lima Sister City Association's Educational</u> <u>Youth Home-Stay in Harima-cho, Japan and Japan Tour:</u>

- *Student must be a ninth, tenth, or eleventh grader for the 2022-2023 school year in any Allen County public or private school.
- *Student's academic record must be of a C average or better. Attitude, enthusiasm, and willingness to do his or her best are the primary factors for selection.
- *Student performs well in oral and written communication.
- *Student exhibits a positive interest in the EYH program and exposure to different cultures and languages. (Japanese language ability is NOT a requirement.)
- *Student is currently or is interested in becoming an active member of his or her school and community.
- *Student behaves according to socially acceptable standards.
- *Student works well as a team member, being an active and cooperative participant.
- *Student understands his or her responsibilities, including airline ticket cost, valid U.S. Passport, all travel expenses, gifts for host family, and attending all orientations.
- *Student will submit all required permission forms in a timely manner.
- *Student will submit HIFA home stay forms in a timely manner.
- *Students and parents understand all payments must be made in timely manner and follow pay schedule
- *Application must be submitted by the November 12, 2022, deadline.

About the Lima Sister Cities Association (LSCA)

The Lima Sister Cities Association was formed in 1995 to establish Sister City relationships with one or more foreign cities. We have developed a solid, intimate friendship with the city of Harima-cho, Japan. The friendship has grown from an Official Delegation sent to pave the way, to Business Delegations, Adult Cultural Homestays, to the Assistant English Teacher Program, and to the Educational Youth Homestays. In addition, Harima-cho sends delegations, adult homestays, and youth homestays to Lima bi-annually.

The purpose of LSCA is as follows:

*To introduce the Lima community to the people, cultures, and economy of comparable foreign cities.

*To facilitate the development of extensive personal relationships between a cross-section of the Lima social and economic community with its Sister Cities.

*To develop programs and activities that will disseminate information about the Sister Cities throughout Lima as well as to encourage the discussion and learning about our Sister Cities across the full range of public, private, and business institutions.

About the Educational Youth Homestay

The youth homestays began in 2001 when the Lima Sister Cities Association sent the first group of eight Lima-area high school students to share American culture with Harima-cho Junior High students. The Japanese Junior High school curriculum includes the study of English. Unfortunately, these Japanese students do not get much opportunity to interact with native English speakers. The Harima-cho International Friendship Association requested a Youth Home-stay exchange to provide an amazing global cultural opportunity for both Japanese and American students. The 2001 visit was a great success. The Youth Homestay exchanges were repeated in 2002, 2004, 2006, 2008, 2010, 2012, 2014, 2016 and 2018 as Lima sent groups of area high school students to Harima-cho, Japan. We will be offering another rare opportunity for a Youth Exchange and tour of Japan in June 2023.

All youth Home-Stay delegations include adult chaperones. The students are placed in Japanese homes and stay with families during the Harima-cho exchange. Every Japanese family that applies is reviewed by the Harima-cho International Friendship Association (HIFA) as well as LSCA before being selected as a host family.

Our travelers' safety is the top priority of LSCA as well as HIFA.

Prior to the trip, the student delegates and their parents will be required to participate in several group orientations to acclimate them to the Japanese culture and customs. The students will experience all phases of Japanese life during their visit. They will participate in Japanese traditions, attend Japanese schools, stay in a Japanese home, and share American culture with their new Japanese friends. They will also visit some famous and historical sites. Past examples include: the ancient Buddhist Monastery at Koya-san, the Hiroshima Atom Bomb Museum, Miyajima Island, and the Kyoto "Eiga Mura" Movie Theme Park. Student delegates will be expected to actively participate with LSCA cultural and fundraising events prior to and after the trip. Upon their return to Lima, the Youth Exchange delegates will be expected to write and speak about their experiences for school and community events.

The 2023 Lima Sister Cities Youth Exchange will be early June 2023. (Exact date TBA) LSCA will make all necessary travel arrangements, provide chaperones, and schedule several mandatory orientations to equip our 2023 youth representatives and their parents with the knowledge to ensure a safe, successful educational exchange. Please review all this information with your student and discuss it as a family. This opportunity truly involves the entire family, as it is a big decision. LSCA promises that all safety procedures will be taken, to ensure a positive experience. We are proud of our many past successful youth visits.

LSCA Educational Youth Home-stay Responsibility Agreement

NOTE: This educational opportunity, organized by the Lima Sister Cities Association, requires that youth selected through the application process be responsible for all travel expenses, personal spending money, and a two-year LSCA family membership (\$50). The cost of the trip is estimated at \$4000.00. The total cost will be determined once we have a final head count and expenses are finalized.

Students are also advised to bring \$500.00 for expenses such as meals and souvenirs.

LSCA will provide the following:

- *All travel arrangements, including to and from Lima to the airport
- *Home-stay accommodations with a Harima-cho host family
- *Harima-cho host family profile for each delegate
- *Adult chaperones
- *Proposed tour agenda before departure
- *Solid, well-structured orientations

We, the undersigned, realize that this program requires me/us (student and parent(s)), if student is chosen as a delegate, to provide for and agree to the following:

- *Students must have a valid passport, cost incurred by the participant
- *Proof of overseas insurance, as required by Japan
- *All travel expenses, personal spending money, and gifts for the host family
 - *Students and parents understand all payments must be made in a timely manner, following payment schedule.
