

Loom Knit Plant Cover

Ewrap cast on. You can use your favorite cast on method or use the chain cast on. Link here:

Next step: Four rows of garter stitch. Garter stitch is a round of knit and a round of purl stitch. Alternating each row.

Next step: Ewrap 10 rows.

Next step: Repeat

Four rows of garter stitch. Garter stitch is a round of knit and a round of purl stitch. Alternating each row.

Finally, we will use the Basic Bind Off. The starting point is to the left of the anchor peg. Wrap in front of the peg and knit off. Wrap the peg next to it and knit off. Take the stitch off of the second peg you wrapped and take it off the peg. Move that stitch to the right and knit over. Next take that stitch and place it back to the peg to the left. Repeat by wrapping the next peg and knit over. Take that stitch off the loom and place it on the peg to the right. Knit that stitch over, take the stitch off the peg and move it back over to the left. Continue this process until the last peg when you take the plant cover off the loom.

You will have two tails. Thread your darning needle and weave the tails ends in. My rule of thumb is to make sure your tails are secure and hidden into your project.
