It was suggested that a letter be drafted to all local manufacturing plants, businesses Etc. requesting permission to use their parking lot for future gym khanas. Marty Rauer was voted in as a new member. The traveling trophy was given to Karen Butterfield for her outstanding ability to wreck two cars at once in her own driveway and endangering her neighbors walking ability.

In June of 1983 There was a fun Rally on the 19th. There was a newspaper article in the June news that reports a Los Angeles jeans maker has put car names on the hip of jeans for teens and men. Example Camaro, Corvette, Firebird but for women the label only reads "style auto" Women "didn't like the idea of "Camaro" filling up their rear end "a spokesman said! ITALIAN POTATO SALAD

3 pounds' potatoes

1/3 cup Italian salad dressing

4 hard cooked eggs, chopped

3/4 cup chopped celery

1/3 cup chopped onion

1/4 cup chopped cucumber

1/4 cup chopped green pepper

1/2 cup mayonnaise

1/4 cup sour cream

1 teaspoon prepared horseradish

Chopped fresh tomatoes

Place potatoes in a saucepan: cover with water. Bring to boil and cook until tender; drain and cool. Peel and cube potatoes, place in a large bowl. Add dressing, toss to coat. Cover and chill foe 2 hours. Add eggs, celery, onion, cucumber and green pepper; mix well in a small bowl. Combine mayonnaise, sour cream and horseradish. Mix well. Pour over mixture and toss to coat. Chill at least one hour. Top with tomatoes and serve. Serves 8 to 10 people.
