In October of 1973 John Short reported that on Oct. 7th 20 brave Corvette drivers took their sparkling clean "machines" out into the fog and drizzle, loaded FAMILIES, games and beer mugs to follow a bent and broken green Chevelle to a beautiful clump of trees called Backbone State Park. Upon arrival in the park it was soon determined that someone of great importance and personal magnitude would have to procure a shelter for the hungry and thirsty crowd. This person was to be the one and only 'Skippy" Morrison. As soon as Skip had done his thing, they proceeded to devour 375 lbs. of brats, 600 gallons of beer and played several games of football and Frisbee.
