2018 Car Show Update!!!

We have another new home for our annual charity car show for 2018, and the committee is beginning to feel like nomads wandering around in the desert. Our friends out at Hawkeye Downs wanted to hold our date of the second Saturday in June, but couldn't pass up a several thousand dollar deal for a big truck race on that date while we were thinking things over. Options included changing the date and staying at HD, but we decided to look for a new venue.

Hats off to Al Willenborg, who happened to check with the Cedar Hills Community Church, not far from his home on the corner of "E" Avenue and Stony Point Rd., NW. Lo and behold, they are an "event venue" complete with standardized contracts. We are now locked in for June 9th with a deposit and guaranteed not to be uprooted with any other church events. It looks like we'll have the option of holding that date for future shows, also. Other positive aspects of having the show there include:

A paved parking lot, almost the size of the top of Lindale Mall's parkade, with 2 long paved entrance roads leading to the back of the church and the paved lot. We also have approval to use the large grassy areas surrounding the church to use as parking for show workers, viewers, vendors and overflow show car entries, if needed.

There is a large canopied drive-thru rear entrance, which will be great for trophies, p.a. system and/or Silent Auction and Garage Sale tables. From there one can enter an air-conditioned commons area with a kitchen and serving area with tables and chairs. The church has the option of having a church group set up food service for their profit or we can hire food service vehicles for the day.

Near the commons area are rooms that we can use for Data Entry, which need to be quiet areas, yet near the club registration trailer outside.

Restrooms are clean and large.

The opposite side of the commons area has a wall of windows with 2 large double glass doors, opening onto a sidewalk where we can set up vendors to display products and services. This will provide interesting things to do for our entrants and viewers.

There is a children's play area on the back side, along with space for featured cars and motorcycles. Overall, there seems to be more than adequate space for special features like military vehicles. There are plans in the works for expanding the church and paved parking lot, also.

The cost is only about \$100 for the day, but we are looking to having the church possibly keep the \$250 deposit, and maybe adding to that amount.

This seems to be an almost perfect spot for our show. It's not a unique venue like parking on a race track, but it is a space that is more easily handled by our aging membership. We ask members to consider getting more involved with the car show, as we can always use more help and some committee members are burning out after many, many years of handling the behind-the-scenes aspects of the show. Contact your current president, Geof Knoerzer, or co-chairs Dick Butschi and Wayne Martin if you would to get in on the workings of the 10-person committee and/or jump on board when the day-of-the-show worker sheet comes out in the next few weeks. It's fun and exciting to get involved with this big fundraiser for our 4 selected charities.
