I have been asked for a few recipies so I am including them here. I hope you all enjoy trying these. The recipe I brought to the last pot luck :

Broccoli and Cauliflower Salad

1 head of Cauliflower, chopped
 1 crown of broccoli, chopped
 [I use equal amounts]
 1 to 2 cups of shredded cheddar cheese
 6 oz bacon bits

Dressing: 1 cup mayo 1 cup sour cream 1 half cup sugar mix together and add to salad. Chill 2 hours and enjoy

My Blue Cheese dressing recipe:

Combine 1/2cup sour cream, 1/4 cup cream style cottage cheese, 1/4 cup mayonaise and 1/4 cup blue cheese. [I like Maytag or Buttermik blue]. Blend until smooth. Crumble in another 1/2cup blue cheese and stir. If it's too thick thin it with a few teaspoons of milk. This will thicken in the refig.

I found this recipe and use it in the fall when the tomatoes are just finishing in the garden. it freezes well for me.

Roasted Tomato Soup

15 large tomatoes [about 5 #]
8 cloves minced garlic
1/4C Plus 2 T canola oil, divided
1 Large onion
2 C water
1 t salt
1/2t crushed red pepper flakes [optional]
1/2c heavy whipping cream

Place seeded tomatoes in a greased 15 x 10 x1 baking pan. Combine garlic and 1/4c oil. Drizzle over tomatoes & toss to coat. Bake @400 degrees for 15 to 20 minutes or until softened stirring occasionally. Cool slightly and remove skins. Meanwhile in a dutch oven saute onion in remaining oil until tender. Add tomatoes, water, salt and optional pepper flakes. Bring to a boil and simmer for 30 minutes. Cool slightly. In a blender process the soup in batches. Return to dutch oven. Stir in cream and heat thru. Cool and transfer to freezer containers. Thaw in refrig overnight. Heat and garnish with basil.
