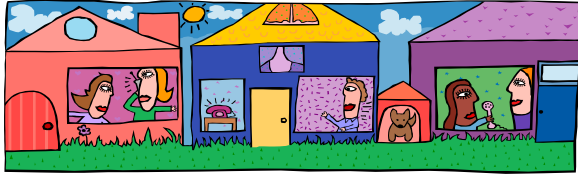

Community Foundation

Social organization set up in the mid '80s to promote good fellowship among its members and to encourage participation in the social activities of the association and the Weston Lakes Country Club

501(c)(3) charitable foundation* (approved in August 2000) established to manage and distribute funds received primarily from:

- Memorial contributions
- Fundraising efforts of WLWA volunteers

Account balance of \$4,000 as of 12-31-24 for WLWA activities (i.e., programs, decorations, hospitality, etc.).

Account balance of \$23,780 as of 12-31-24 (Sufficient funds to cover 2024 scholarship commitments must be maintained. A \$2,000 will remain in the Chase bank account at all times.)
