Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It feels like we are just finishing up our Christmas celebration, and now we are heading into Lent. Ash Wednesday this year begins on February 14, Valentine's Day. I have said, "nothing says I love you like an ash cross on your forehead." And although I have said it with a tongue in cheek, there is really something to this.

Each Ash Wednesday we come forward to the altar and we receive a cross on our fore-head, made from the ashes from the Palms from the previous Palm Sunday. And as the palms were waved and the people said, "Hosanna to God in the Highest" on that day, we will come forward and receive and the cross on our forehead, and the words will be said, "from dust you have come and from dust you shall return." It is a somber day as we begin our journey with Jesus to the cross. But it is that journey, it is that walk, that reminds us that Jesus loves us so much, that he gave his life for us. It is an unconditional love, a love for you and for me that can never be changed. It is a love that says, I will give my life for you!

It is the season where we, as did the early church, focus on fasting, alms giving and prayer. I encourage you to take some time this Lenten Season and consider these three spiritual disciplines. Each Lent we are encouraged to give something up, or take something on, in order to grow closer to God. In line with these Spiritual Disciplines, here are some ways to carry them out.

If your diet allows, fast for a day each week during Lent, and just drink water. If your diet doesn't allow, give up your favorite food for Lent.

Try tithing, (Give 10% of your income) this Lenten Season (or for a Sunday).

Pray daily. Sit quietly for 10, 15, 20 minutes and listen for God to speak. Try to expand the time until you sit for 30 minutes. This will help you focus your day on what is important. Martin Luther said, "I have so much to do that I shall spend the first three hours in prayer."

Lent is a time to try something new, to focus on God, and your relationship. As we begin this Lenten Season, we are once again reminded about our relationship with Christ and our response to Christ's sacrificial act for us.

So as you think about Ash Wednesday this year, as you think about Valentine's Day, I hope that you will consider this love, along with the love for your partner, family and friends! It is the love that teaches us how to love unconditionally, with no strings attached.

Join us this Lenten Season, for Ash Wednesday, Holden Evening Prayer on Wednesday Nights into Holy Week and the Easter Celebration on April 1, April Fool's Day (a topic for the next newsletter!), as we journey with Jesus to the cross.



<u>TITHING JOY!</u> A monthly message from your Stewardship Ministry team

Tithing, a word that strikes fear and trepidation into most church going people, for it brings up the other feared word in church circles, *money*. Yet, tithing is a biblical word. It is found in many places in both the Old and New Testaments, and refers to the practice of giving one tenth of one's income for the work of God. (Biblical references to tithing are found below). Tithing is a guide to be used by God's people in determining "how much" I should share with God and by giving through his community of faith. The tithe is something that every Christian should strive to reach.

Yet tithing can only be achieved once we realize and understand our relationship with God. Tithing is possible when we realize that everything we have, everything we are, everything we hope to be is a GIFT of God. God has blessed us with all that we have and all that he asks is that we give back 10% as a thanksgiving for his benefits. This leaves 90% of all that we have to use and enjoy. As a famous financial guru once said about tithing, "if you can't live off 90% of your income, they you are probably struggling to live off 100% anyway, and that means you have bigger financial problems you need to address."

During the season of Lent as we gather to ponder the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus it seems the appropriate time to take the tithing challenge and try tithing for the six Sundays in Lent. It seems like an awe-some challenge but one that should be easy for people of faith, for people who trust God, for when we tithe we are trusting that God will provide all that we need. Tithing is more about trust and faith than it is about financial resources or ability. If we trust God and have faith in God, as many profess, then tithing will be easy and will bring joy to our lives as we see the results that such tithing brings.
