Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The text for the second Sunday after Christmas is this:

I In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. <sup>2</sup> He was with God in the beginning. <sup>3</sup> Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. <sup>4</sup> In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. <sup>5</sup> The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome<sup>[a]</sup> it.

As I reflect on 2017, I give thanks for Holy Trinity, and the light that they have shined in this community. You have brought light to Chandler and far beyond. Here are some of the things that we have accomplished:

You helped to financially support World Hunger, Lutheran Disaster Response,

You helped to build a Habitat for Humanity House

You provided support for members of this community through Grief Share, Divorce Care and Cancer Care

Held a day of service in March to serve our community

Provided 300 health kits and pancakes to people experiencing homelessness in Phoenix

And the list could go on. I give thanks each day for the generosity of this congregation, and how you see yourselves as part of the community. The call committee at Holy Trinity asked me what excited you about Holy Trinity? One of the things I said was that the church sees themselves as part of the community and the community as part of the church! That is my vision for Holy Trinity.

A pastor friend of mine, used to ask his congregation, "if this congregation disappeared tomorrow, who would care?" He wanted the congregation to understand that they did not exist for themselves, but for the sake of the world.

Each day I am reminded at Holy Trinity, how this congregation understands that we exist for the sake of the world and how you share God's light in the world. If Holy Trinity disappeared tomorrow, the community would know, the community would care because of the good work you do!

As you know, Holy Trinity is sponsoring and building a house with our Coalition partners of Desert Cross, Mountain View and Esperanza Lutheran churches. Many of you are willing to work on Saturdays or provide lunch for the workers. Thanks for your continued support of this effort!

All the money to sponsor our Habitat house is raised by contributions from members and friends -no Holy Trinity funds are used in this ministry. Habitat is a charitable organization; therefore, most contributions qualify as an Arizona income tax credit. The amounts of the credit this year are \$800 for married filing a joint return and \$400 for single tax payers. This tax credit is separate from and in addition to similar tax credits for your contributions to public schools and private school tuition organizations. Ask Mary Larsen if you have any Arizona tax credit questions or check out the Arizona State website at www.azdor.gov/About/FAQs/CharitableTaxCredit.aspx

During November and December, we will be asking you to make your contribution to the house as soon as you can by writing a check payable to "Habitat For Humanity – Central AZ" but marking the memo line "Holy Trinity" and providing it to our church office manager, Judi Carle. It is really important to enclose your check in an envelope marked "Habitat for Humanity" and place the envelope in the offering plate or provide it to the church office so it does not go into the general Holy Trinity fund. This way, you will receive letter receipts from both Habitat and the Holy Trinity Habitat committee to use when filing your taxes.

#### **Endowment Fund Committee News**
