Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It feels like we are just finishing up our Christmas celebration, and now we are heading into Lent. Ash Wednesday this year begins on February 14, Valentine's Day. I have said, "nothing says I love you like an ash cross on your forehead." And although I have said it with a tongue in cheek, there is really something to this.

Each Ash Wednesday we come forward to the altar and we receive a cross on our forehead, made from the ashes from the Palms from the previous Palm Sunday. And as the palms were waved and the people said, "Hosanna to God in the Highest" on that day, we will come forward and receive and the cross on our forehead, and the words will be said, "from dust you have come and from dust you shall return." It is a somber day as we begin our journey with Jesus to the cross. But it is that journey, it is that walk, that reminds us that Jesus loves us so much, that he gave his life for us. It is an unconditional love, a love for you and for me that can never be changed. It is a love that says, I will give my life for you!

It is the season where we, as did the early church, focus on fasting, alms giving and prayer. I encourage you to take some time this Lenten Season and consider these three spiritual disciplines. Each Lent we are encouraged to give something up, or take something on, in order to grow closer to God. In line with these Spiritual Disciplines, here are some ways to carry them out.

If your diet allows, fast for a day each week during Lent, and just drink water. If your diet doesn't allow, give up your favorite food for Lent.

Try tithing, (Give 10% of your income) this Lenten Season (or for a Sunday).

Pray daily. Sit quietly for 10, 15, 20 minutes and listen for God to speak. Try to expand the time until you sit for 30 minutes. This will help you focus your day on what is important. Martin Luther said, "I have so much to do that I shall spend the first three hours in prayer."

Lent is a time to try something new, to focus on God, and your relationship. As we begin this Lenten Season, we are once again reminded about our relationship with Christ and our response to Christ's sacrificial act for us.

So as you think about Ash Wednesday this year, as you think about Valentine's Day, I hope that you will consider this love, along with the love for your partner, family and friends! It is the love that teaches us how to love unconditionally, with no strings attached.

Join us this Lenten Season, for Ash Wednesday, Holden Evening Prayer on Wednesday Nights into Holy Week and the Easter Celebration on April 1, April Fool's Day (a topic for the next newsletter!), as we journey with Jesus to the cross.

SACRIFICIAL JOY!

A monthly message from your Stewardship Ministry Team

St. Paul writes these words in his second of two letters to his people in Corinth: "Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." (v.9:7) In these words St. Paul shares with his fellow believers that there is an expectation that those who call themselves believers in the Christ of God will share of their bounty with the community so that the work of the church can continue.

Ever since Paul penned those words, religious and non-religious people alike give away vast amount of money every day, week, month and year. Many do it anonymously and many do it sacrificially in ways that they cannot possibly receive anything in return. As Mark Allen Powell in his book, Giving to God, states, "they just give their money away, sometimes without even expecting any acknowledgment or appreciation for what they have done." He then poses these questions, "Why? What could possible prompt seemingly sane people to give away their money?".

Interesting questions which beg an answer. The answer is four-fold: 1) to give thanks, 2) to express love for God, 3) to make a difference, and 4) to experience joy. And many times, to accomplish this four-fold aspect of giving requires, and dare we use the word, SACRIFICE. Sacrifice shows itself in many forms. It may be in the form of getting up early on a Sunday morning to cook pancakes for homeless individuals when you would rather sleep in. It could be giving up a dinner out with family



and giving that money to a food bank. It could be donning work clothes and helping to rebuild a house destroyed by a hurricane. It could also mean choosing to give 10% of one's income so that the work of God's community of faith can be accomplished.

As we continue the Lenten journey to the cross and the tomb, we will be reminded of the SACRIFICE Christ made for us and for our salvation on that wooden cross. And if we consider such a gift as this, nothing we do in response can really be considered a sacrifice, but simply what we do to give thanks to God for his great love which will be make a difference in the world and bring us boundless JOY!
