Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

September 25 – October 6, I will be traveling to Ethiopia and to Malawi. I have been planning this trip for almost two years, after returning from Romania.

Two years ago, I traveled to Romania, to learn about the culture and to build Habitat Houses. That was suppose to be the Largest Habitat week long build ever, celebrating 40 years of Habitat for Humanity and building 40 houses in one week. Because of some political strife and change in power, I spent a week building roof trusses because they could not get the building permits (even though all the foundations had been poured). A year later those Habitat Houses have been completed and the trusses have been used.





This year I am going to build Habitat Houses in Malawi. This time we are building homes made of brick. We will be building for two families. The first is a couple and their 8 children. The father had cancer of the leg and has had difficult supporting his family since then.

The father said "I will be happy to own a habitat house, when it rains we usually find our things wet, especially food, beddings and school books for children, the house is also not spacious to accommodate my whole family, if given a chance to benefit from the project all these challenges will be history."

The second family we are building for is a widow, age 30, and her four children.

"Life will be completely changed for us as we will have peace of mind not having to worry about where to keep our things when it is raining. We will greatly thank God for that." Said the mother.



In addition to building Habitat houses, I will have an opportunity to visit Ethiopia. This will include experiencing the festival of Meskel, the finding of the "true cross" on which Jesus was crucified and visiting the Lalibela Rock Churches.

I give thanks for the opportunity to use my vacation and continuing education time to have this once in a life time experience where I can serve my neighbor across the world and have a greater understanding of the expressions of the Christian Faith.

While I am gone, Pastor Bernie has graciously agreed to fill in for me, and we won't miss a beat here at Holy Trinity.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I am sending this letter on behalf of the council in the interest of keeping the congregation in the loop regarding our staffing at Holy Trinity: where we are today and where we would like to go.

I want to start by stating the obvious, that a few short years ago we had three staff members rostered by the ELCA to provide pastoral care at Holy Trinity. Now, with Darcy's departure, we are down to one. While our membership numbers are smaller than a few years ago, our pastoral care needs have not changed significantly. Pastor Chris is working very hard to ensure that the needs of the congregation are being met; however, the effort that is required for this is unsustainable for a single individual beyond the near term. To actively address this in the near term, Rachel Gomez-Acosta has agreed to assist with youth ministry through the end of year. Another possibility as both a near and long-term solution is to explore hiring a part-time visitation or seasonal pastor. I will talk more about this below.

In the medium term, we are considering hiring Luis Ochoa, who currently serves as a youth director for an ELCA congregation in Wasilla, Alaska. Luis is bilingual in Spanish and has experience working with a multi-cultural congregation in Los Angeles. Luis will also be entering Seminary online via the ELCA's Theological Education for Emerging Ministries (T.E.E.M.) program at the start of next year. Luis could potentially check many boxes for us here at Holy Trinity. First, he would serve as a replacement for Darcy as youth director. Second, he would help us serve the needs of our nearest neighbors who are more than fifty percent Latino. Finally, because of his status as a T.E.E.M. seminarian and with special permission from our Bishop, he could provide pastoral care to the congregation when needed, giving respite to Pastor Chris. An additional advantage for bringing Luis on is that we will be seeking funding from the Synod to pay the portion of his salary directed toward neighborhood outreach.

One of the concerns raised at the last congregational town hall was that by hiring someone to work on both youth and neighborhood outreach programming we will be reducing the hours spent on our current youth programs. This is a misconception that likely stems from the fact that Darcy's title was that of youth director. Darcy was involved in many other ministries at Holy Trinity and the synod apart from managing our youth program and, by her reckoning, spent about half of her time working on other assignments.

The council has come to see that even with hiring an additional full-time staff member, we might still be spreading our human resources a little thin in terms of the pastoral care needs of the congregation. Pastor Chris has noted that visitations and funerals have the greatest impact on her ability to plan her weekly activities. This is because the needs in these areas are unplanned and the time required can be quite variable. To assist Pastor Chris in this area, the council is considering the possibility of hiring a part-time visitation or seasonal pastor. This person would see to some of the visitation needs of the congregation, assist with funerals, and occasionally serve on Sunday morning's when Pastor Chris is out of town or on vacation.

Finally, the council believes that the congregation has a role to play in seeing that the work of the church is accomplished. We are attempting to have ministry teams serve a greater role in planning and executing the work of the congregation. I would encourage everyone to consider what gifts they might bring to this and help where they are able.

The council will keep the congregation informed on all our activities in these areas and seek out congregational input whenever possible. Thank you for your continued faithfulness.

Every Sunday at Holy Trinity, we hear words of God that he spoke to his people who lived thousands of years ago in a world very different from the world in which we live. Many Sundays the word that God shares with us through scripture readings and through the words of our resident prophet, Pastor Chris, are words that give us comfort as well as words that challenge us to action. On any given Sunday, the word we hear can uplift us or it can make us feel as if we have fallen short of what God expects. Such is the nature of God's word. It can at one and the same time bring joy as well as demand.

God's word, whether it comes from the mouths of prophets like Amos, Isaiah, or Jeremiah or through the words of Jesus, is a word that will always challenge us to be all that we can be. God is calling us to use what he has given us – our time, our talents, and our treasures – so that others may know the joy we experience in our lives as children of God.
