






Blue Christmas Service Sunday, December 22nd at 2:00 pm

The Global Water and Sanitation Crisis impacts poor families in remote villages the most.

More than 25% of new water projects fail in just three years.

Not all water projects are created equal. The UN estimates that in Sub-Saharan Africa alone, between 30-60% of wells have failed
