
The Council agenda, minutes and financials are posted on the mobile bulletin board on the patio for review.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

What are your devotional practices? How do you center yourself on God? Maybe you do so through daily devotion, Bible study, meditation, or yoga. Have you ever tried walking a labyrinth?

In May, June and July, Philip Eirdiem, and many, many volunteers created a labyrinth for Holy Trinity. They did an amazing job! We used it at camp this summer with our youth. It is just one more way to focus and center yourself.

A labyrinth looks like a maze, but there is only one way in and one way out. There is no right way to walk a labyrinth. You only have to enter and follow the path.



However, your walk can encompass a variety of attitudes. It may be joyous or somber. It might be thoughtful or prayerful. You may use it as a walking meditation. Adults are often serious in the labyrinth. Children most often run in and out as fast as they can in a playful manner. When you walk a labyrinth choose your attitude. From time to time choose a different attitude. Make it serious, prayerful, or playful. Walk alone or with a crowd. Most of all pay attention to your experience.

Some general guidelines for walking a labyrinth are:

- 1. <u>Focus</u>: Pause and wait at the entrance. Become quiet and centered. Give acknowledgment through a bow, nod, or other gesture and then enter.
- 2. <u>Experience</u>: Walk purposefully. Observe the process. When you reach the center, stay there and focus several moments. Leave when it seems appropriate. Be attentive on the way out.
- 3. Exit: Turn and face the entrance. Give an acknowledgement of ending, such as "Amen."
- 4. <u>Reflect</u>: After walking the labyrinth reflect back on your experience. Use journaling or drawing to capture your experience.

On October 2 from 6:00 to 7:30 PM, you are invited to come and walk the labyrinth. It usually takes about 40 minutes to walk but can take more or less depending on your own pace.

Whether you come and enjoy the labyrinth, or use some other way to focus on your walk with God, I encourage you to do so, in whatever way that feeds you.

GIVING – AN ACT OF WORSHIP AND LOVE


A monthly message from your stewardship ministry team.

Each Sunday we engage in the practice of "passing the plate" and collecting money. Have you ever wondered why we go through this ritual? Is it simply to raise funds to meet budgetary expenses such as paying the pastor, or keeping the lights burning, or is it done for a deeper reason? If we think the point of the offering is simply to collect funds for church expenses than we probably derive no more satisfaction from this portion of the liturgy that we do from paying our electric bill. So why do it? Because the purpose of the Sunday morning offering is not to collect funds for covering the church's operating expenses but provides each worshipper with the opportunity to express their love for God in the purest way imaginable, *by giving up something we value – our money!* We give to God as an act of worship, as an act of love.

At Holy Trinity members show their love to God by sharing their monetary resources in a number of ways. Many members utilize the envelope system that the congregation provides every member for their use. Each member receives a numbered box of envelopes that permit them to place their checks or cash contributions into the envelope and bring it to worship to place it in the plate when it is passed as part of the liturgy. The numbering system allows the congregation to track member contributions and remit to them a yearly accounting of their gifts for tax purposes. (All contributions to religious organizations are tax-deductible). Another avenue for giving is a practice called "Simply Giving". "Simply Giving" permits members to contribute their offerings electronically through bank transfers. (If you wish to begin this way of giving simply contact our office manager, Judi Carle and she will facilitate the process for you.) Since a number of members use this system it may explain why some members pass the plate without physically making a contribution and not because they don't love God.

And a final way Holy Trinity receives offerings is through the "TEXT for Giving" program. A guide tract is provided at the sanctuary entrance to help you understand the process, but here is how it is done: 1. Send a text to 480-426-8375 with the amount you want to contribute. 2. You will receive a text with a link to register. 3. Enter your name and credit or debit card information. 4. When complete you receive a text verification and a receipt via email. 5. If you wish to text again simply text the amount and it will be processed automatically.

Giving, as an act of worship, is our way of expressing our gratitude, our love, and our devotion to a God who has blessed us beyond measure. Giving, as an act of worship, takes us beyond duty to delight.



Mission Development:

On August $18^{th} - 23^{rd}$, 2019 the ELCA paid for two of my Mission Development team members and myself to attend a training in Baltimore, the training was broken in two parts:

Boundaries Training- In our boundaries training we learned about different things that affect our performance in the ministry. This included things such as personal health, time management, spiritual growth, church dynamics, behaviors among our peers and self-care. We were given tools to help us with various ways of communicating and coping with the changes in community and the life of the church.

Mission Developing- We focused on developing a 90-day plan, as well as attending workshops to discuss topics such as Mental Health, LGBTQIA, leadership and growth in the church. We heard from different churches who have a unique ministry that started with their existing churches. Overall the training was very informative and provided our mission development team with access to resources and information that will help our ministry here at HTLC.

Our 90-day plan includes some goals that we are already accomplishing, such as, weekly one-on-one meetings in the community, starting an afterschool tutoring program for homework and reading, and continuing our Adventure Break Camp in the fall. Other goals we plan on completing in the next three months include Spanish lessons for our congregation, cultural community events and more one-on-one conversations with schools, neighborhood, and other leaders from our community.


