Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I love being part of a congregation because I get to see people I love every week. I get to catch up with what is happening in their lives and worship and celebrate with them.

But sometimes, that is the problem with congregations. We want to catch up with those we know, but then we neglect to make visitors feel welcome. This is not because we don't want to meet new people, but because we want to catch up with our friends. In addition, for some who are shy, making small talk with a visitor can be difficult! We don't want to embarrass ourselves and ask someone who has been a member for a while if they are new! Maybe they just attend another service!

So what are some things that we can do to welcome those who are in our midst and even make those who have been in our congregation for a while feel more at home.

- Ushers are a first line of welcoming. Make sure you welcome everyone to Holy Trinity! It is fun to hang out with the ushers and joke, and there is time for that too, but we also want to make sure that each person that comes in is greeted! Most people make up their mind about a congregation within the first 10 minutes of being there!
- Another thing we can do is look around the patio, is there one person or a maybe a couple, who are standing by themselves. If so, go up and begin a conversation! If you don't know them, and are not sure if they are members, you can say something like, "I don't think we have met". They usually respond, "no we are new", or "we usually attend the other service," etc.
- If you are at the welcome center or hosting the drink table, make sure that you welcome each person that comes us, ask them how they are doing! You can always comment about the weather or ask them how their day is going.
- Make sure that you greet those who are in front of you, behind you, and in the same pew as you are every week. If you don't know them, make sure you introduce them to me or Pastor Bernie on the way out! Show them the welcome center and get them a mug!

I know when people fall through the cracks, it is never intentional. We get wrapped up in the day to day activities of being a part of Holy Trinity, catching up with friends, and running to a meeting.

But remember as it says in Hebrews:

Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers, for by so doing some people have shown hospitality to **angels** without knowing it (Hebrews 31:2).

### ADULT EDUCATION CLASSES AT HOLY TRINITY

#### <u>"IN THE FOOTSTEPS OF JESUS"</u> When: September 19 – November 21 Day and Time: Thursdays 6:30 to 7:45 Instructors: Pastor Chris Stoxen and Pastor Bernie Carl

### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

When Jesus walked the hills and valleys of his native Galilee, he was surrounded by structures, valleys, and cities that echoed with the voices of past generations. From Abraham to John the Baptist, from Canaanite rulers to Roman oppressors Jesus footsteps traversed land that witnessed much history over two millennia. The land of Israel, the land where Jesus was born, proclaimed a new word, and died on a cross is seen as Holy not only by followers of Jesus but by Jews and Muslims as well. This ten-session course will examine, through discussion and biblical examination, not only Israel's conflicted history but how Jesus appearance in the various cities and towns changed the face of Israel in innumerable way. Each session will feature the leader sharing information about the various places that Jesus walked, discuss the importance of those places in Jesus' life and ministry, refer to biblical passages of events that occurred in those places and provide time for discussion and questions from class members. Videos, maps, study notes, and Biblical references will be shared throughout the sessions.

Beginning on SUNDAY, AUGUST 25 Pastor Bernie and others, will be present on the patio between services to share more information and to register those who wish to be part of this new and informative class offering.
