# 95 Years of Chesaning Chamber

Just over two decades from the birth of the Chesaning Chamber of Commerce, the end of World War II brought new opportunities to the area. Chamber President Fred Gewirtz and Secretary Chester Howell reported on the year's activities at the Chamber's post-war program, Community Chest, while members enjoyed a meal of sauerkraut and wieners.

In 1945, the Chamber was supported by membership numbering 160. The Chamber letterhead touted Chesaning as "A Beautiful City with a Low Tax Rate and Fine City Parks and Fine Pure Water. A City of Fine Churches and Schools." Chesaning was definitely a "Fine City to Live In" as home to Peet Packing

Seven days a week, Bob and Dave and their staff offer expert advice, materials and supplies for all your home improvement and building projects as well as Penske Truck rentals for your personal or business needs. Their business name highlights one of their most unique features - "YOU drive into the yard, YOU load the lumber that YOU want directly into YOUR vehicle, and then YOU pay for YOUR load. It's fast, simple, Self Serve!"

As their website notes, the story of Self Serve Lumber begins back in 1933 on Saginaw's east side when Arthur Schwannecke started a coal company known as L. C. Smith Coal Co. During the coal business downturn Arthur's son William, who had experience working in the lumber industry, went into partnership with his father and in 1953 the company became L. C. Smith Coal and Lumber

Co. In a few short years they dropped the coal business and became L. C. Smith Lumber Co. In 1956 Arthur's other son Robert came on board and in 1958 the three opened Reliable Cash and



Carry. As the business grew, a need was found to serve Saginaw's west side and the first Self Serve Lumber was opened in 1963 on Weiss St. Soon they found convenience was key, they were open nights and weekends when traditional lumber yards were only open five days a week. In 1979 Arthur passed away and William took over as President and CEO."

Over the years our product line has expanded greatly to serve our customers. Stores have continued to open starting in Saginaw and throughout the Mid-Michigan area. Currently, Self Serve Lumber and Home Center is a fourth generation family business operating 19 locations. https://selfservelumber.com/about
