

## Run for the Bulls 5K-Run/2-Mile Walk Fundraiser: \$87,901

These fundraisers have proved to be tremendously successful due to the huge support of our sponsors, businesses, community, schools, and participants. Each fall, PEF sponsors this event which provides funding for grants, scholarships, special activities, and programs. The morning starts off at the high school early as volunteers set up tables and chairs, and the Peninsula Track Club sets up their banners and equipment in preparation to officially time the runners and walkers. PEF directors pass out packets that include t-shirts and they register participants, volunteers receive their signs, and PHS choral students gather to sing the national anthem. A local company furnishes hot coffee and chicken biscuits for the early bird workers, and later at the primary school for the runners and walkers at the finish line. Occasionally, one can spot a participant dressed in a Halloween costume! Near the end of the event, medals are awarded and prize winners are announced.

# Classroom, Student, and Teacher Grants: \$45,266

Classroom grants support curricular and extra-curricular needs such as STEM materials, reading resources, books, field trips, and technology. Grants are awarded twice a year. Instructional grants are up to \$300 and innovative grants, \$1,000. Student grants go to those who are going to national & international competitions. Teacher grants are awarded to those who are engaged in further education, attending conferences / workshops / conventions, and teachers who are designated as Division Teachers of the Year.

During the past two years, PEF awarded 41 scholarships for a total of \$66,400: June 2022, \$37,300, 22 scholarships and May 2023, \$29,100, 19 scholarships.
