Schuylkill County is located in northeastern Pennsylvania, in the heart of PA's historical Coal Region. The county was created on March 1, 1811, from parts of Berks and Northampton counties and named for the Schuylkill River, which originates in the county. On March 3, 1818, additional territory in the northeast was added from Columbia and Luzerne counties. The county is part of the Pottsville micropolitan statistical area.

As of the 2020 census, the population was 143,049.



VILLAGE GUEST RULES

STRONGLY ENFORCED

We pride ourselves on providing clean and safe rental units for guests' enjoyment. Please treat the home as if it were your own. Guest(s) must follow these rules at all times.

NO SMOKING/DRUG USE

Smoking and drug usage is a violation and will not be tolerated. This includes smoking tobacco and marijuana, illegal drugs, e-cigarettes, vape pens, diffusers, hookahs, incense, cigars, and burning candles. Violating this policy will incur a fee of up to \$1,000 charged to the rental guest.

RESPECT PROPERTY

Clean Up After Yourself: If something overcooks/runs over in the stove, microwave, or refrigerator, please clean it up.

Do No Damage: Enjoy the luxury towels, linens, blankets, and pillows. Please do not stain or damage them. This includes the furniture and flooring.

Only Flush Toilet Paper: Damages caused by discarding other items via the toilet will not only cost you additional plumbing fees, but you will be without facilities for the remainder of your stay.

Stick To The Limit/No Party Policy: The occupancy limit is 4 per house with the exception of Sears Main Floor (6). No unregistered guests or pets allowed. Unregistered guest(s) will be considered trespassors. Sneaking pet(s) onto/into the property will terminate your stay immediately.

Consumables: Coffee, condiments, and other consumables are complimentary. Guest discretion and inspection before consuming these items are required. We take no responsibility for the consumables or any allergies that guest(s) may have.

Private Areas: Guests are encouraged to enjoy the unit they rented and Village public areas: hiking trails, swings, the Grove, and the Magical Fern Garden. Additional houses and buildings are off limits and private property. Please refer to the property map, located in this guidebook and posted on the porch of Old Red House, for amenities available to guests.

Trash & Recycling: Please remove all trash from the house and dispose of it into the receptacles on the porch of Old Red House. Note there is a separate blue recycling container if you choose to recycle.

Towels/Linens: Remove all towels, pillowcases, and bed sheets and put them in the laundry basket.

General: Wash, dry, and put away kitchen items used. Turn off lights. Close and lock all windows and doors. Return heat and/or A/C to original settings.

Violations will not be tolerated. If policies are broken, your stay will be terminated and additional fees applied.

From America's First Flag Stop

Houser's Crossing to Pennsylvania's Most Charming Small Town

Skip the traffic and parking worries and begin your Jim Thorpe adventure the old-fashioned way—by train. Arrive at our private passenger station at Houser's Crossing and enjoy the anticipation as the train approaches. Once aboard the Reading Blue Mountain & Northern Railroad, your journey will unfold at an easy pace. You'll pass through the Tamaqua tunnel, roll high above the landscape on the iconic Hometown



High Bridge and take in sweeping views of beautiful Lake Hauto—all before arriving in historic Jim Thorpe. **The train ride is approximately 50 minutes, with departures typically at 10:00 a.m. and returns at 5:00 p.m.,** allowing plenty of time to explore the town's shops, restaurants, and historic charm. Guests may ride the train on the day of check-in and the day of check-out. On both days, **guests are asked to park their cars by the passenger station and, on the day of check-out, complete check-out from their accommodations prior to boarding.**



Train Ride Details & Boarding Instructions

OPERATING SCHEDULE:

Train service to Jim Thorpe is primarily offered on weekends and select holidays, including Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, President's Day, St. Patrick's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, and Labor Day. Train schedules and times are subject to change at the railroad's discretion.

TICKETING PROCESS:

To ensure a smooth and worry-free journey, guests are required to purchase train tickets in advance. Ordering early is highly recommended, as trains—especially during peak times and holiday weekends—often sell out.


There are two types of train tickets available to purchase:

1. **Roundtrip Tickets from Houser's Crossing to Jim Thorpe** – This allows you to enjoy the scenic 50-minute journey to historic Jim Thorpe and back. When you purchase a roundtrip ticket, you also have the option to purchase a deeply discounted ticket for The Lehigh Gorge Scenic Railway.
2. **Lehigh Gorge Scenic Railway Train Ride** – Departs from the Jim Thorpe Train Station at 1:00 p.m. and travels into the stunning Lehigh Gorge State Park. The ride is 70 minutes. During peak Fall Foliage Season, the ride is 45 minutes, and our guests enjoy an exclusive perk: the ability to pre-purchase Lehigh Gorge tickets. This means no waiting in long lines to secure these prized train tickets.

When you board at Houser's Crossing, you will receive your roundtrip train tickets and, if purchased, your Lehigh Gorge Scenic Railway tickets, making your entire day of rail adventures simple and convenient.

HOW TO PURCHASE TICKETS

Tickets can be purchased on our website (HousersCrossing.com) during the online reservation process. After selecting your overnight accommodations, you'll have the option to "add on" train tickets available during your stay. Alternatively, you may arrange tickets directly with Owner Carolee, who is happy to assist you in planning a seamless and memorable train experience.

Appalachian Trail

The Appalachian Trail is a 2,190+ mile long public footpath that traverses the scenic, wooded, pastoral, wild, and culturally resonant lands of the Appalachian Mountains. Conceived in 1921, built by private citizens, and completed in 1937, the trail is managed today by the National Park Service, US Forest Service, Appalachian Trail Conservancy, numerous state agencies and thousands of volunteers.

Owl Creek Reservoir

Upper Owl Creek Reservoir and Lower Owl Creek Reservoir are 67-acre and 26-acre impoundments, respectively, created by two adjacent dams on Owl Creek, a tributary to the Little Schuylkill River, located south of Tamaqua Borough, Schuylkill County. Upper Owl Creek Reservoir was opened to fishing in 2002 after the Borough decided to allow low-impact recreation. At that time, the lower reservoir had been drained and was dry with the reservoir bottom characterized by a thicket of shrubs among numerous natural boulders.

A deep, steep-walled gorge carved by a river, thick vegetation, rock outcroppings, and waterfalls characterize Lehigh Gorge State Park. In Luzerne and Carbon counties in eastern Pennsylvania, the park follows the Lehigh River from the outlet of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Francis E. Walter Dam at the northern end, to the town of Jim Thorpe at the southern end of the park. Whitewater boating and biking are popular activities.
