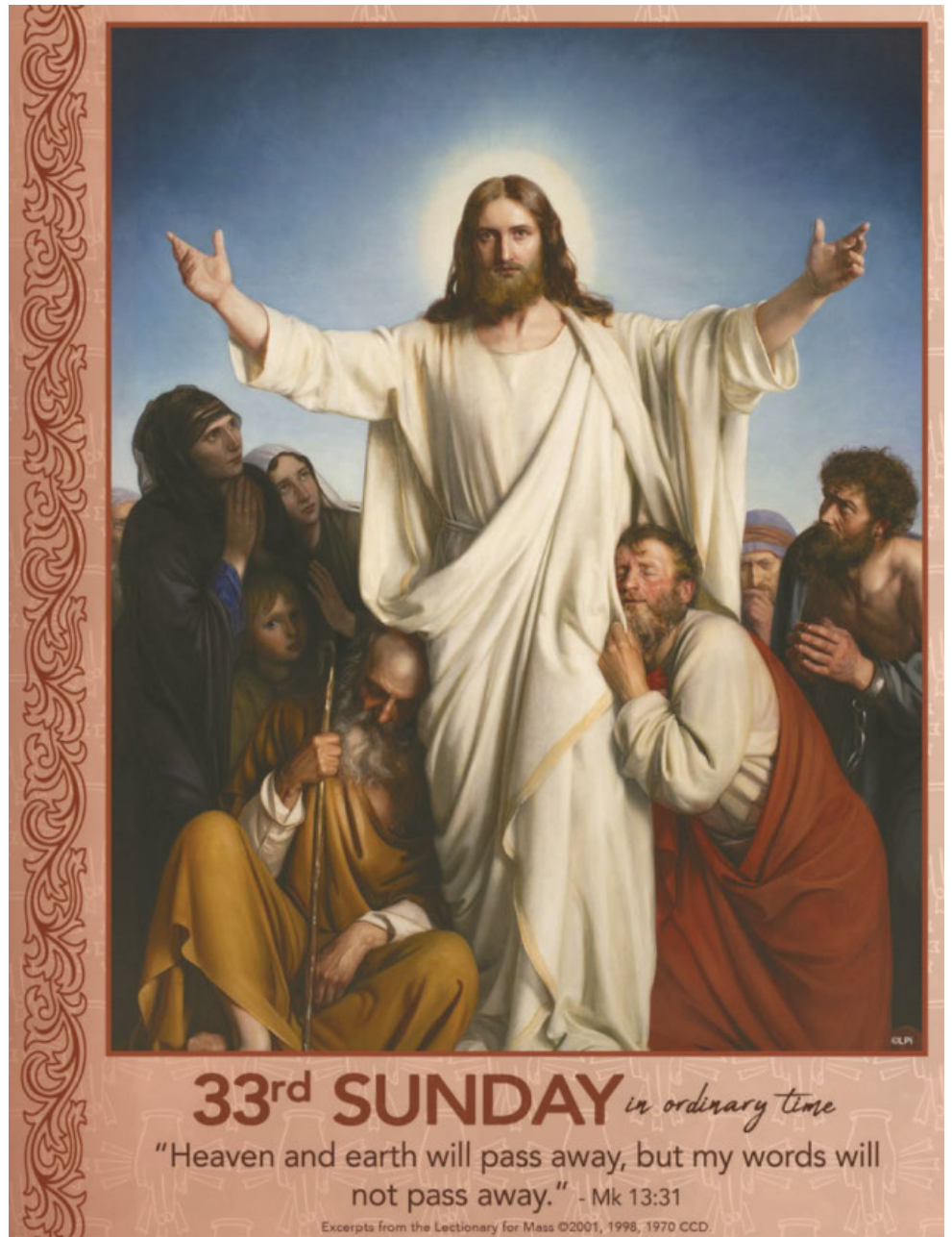

Nebraska Bishop's Statement November 6, 2024 *Lincoln, Nebraska* – On Tuesday, November 5th, Nebraska voters rejected an extreme abortion ballot proposal, Initiative 439, and simultaneously passed Initiative 434. Archbishop George J. Lucas of the Archdiocese of Omaha, Bishop James D. Conley of the Diocese of Lincoln, and Bishop Joseph G. Hanefeldt of the Diocese of Grand Island issued the following joint statement:

Praise be to God for an inspiring victory for Nebraska women and children! We are overjoyed at the prudent defeat of Initiative 439 and the success of Initiative 434. Nebraskans have sent a clear message to the rest of our nation: Nebraska is a pro-life state that will stand up for its most vulnerable citizens. We are grateful for the thousands of Nebraskans who worked tirelessly to ensure that their neighbors understood Initiative 439's flaws. Their dedication and hard work are reflected in this victory, and we rejoice with them. As we celebrate this important victory for life and the dignity of the human person, we reaffirm our longstanding commitment to every mother, father, child, and family in our state, to work for their support, and to be, in the words of Pope Francis, 'islands of mercy in a sea of indifference.' We call on every Nebraskan to join us in this mission of mercy, love, and unyielding resolve.

May those who are sick and suffering be assured of the goodness and value of their lives.

Disposal of Religious Items:

As Catholics, we are accustomed to having religious objects "blessed," which signifies the permanent sanctification and dedication of an object for some sacred purpose. Once a religious object is blessed and dedicated for divine worship or veneration, it must be treated with reverence and must not be used in either an improper nor profane way (cf. Code of Canon Law, #1171). What happens when the rosary or statue breaks and is irreparable? What happens when the palm dries out, and the following Palm Sunday provides us with new palm? The basic rule for the disposition of these items is to burn or bury them. Therefore, the normal "rule of thumb" is that anything that has been blessed should be burned (and then the ashes buried), or simply buried.

As a Catholic, collecting sacramentals such as votive candles, religious pictures, medals, palm branches and other miscellaneous religious items is common. Sometimes these items also break. What do you do if you are unsure if they are blessed? One option could be (if they are still useable) to give them away to other people who could use them. If this is not possible, there are other options.

Respectful disposal: It is not a sin to throw away blessed items, but out of proper respect, one should dispose of them in this way by burying or burning them. Do not throw them in the landfill. If devotional items were not blessed, such as holy cards and other items that come in the mail, they are simply pictures and can be thrown away in the trash. If you feel uncomfortable throwing them away, you can burn or bury them as well.

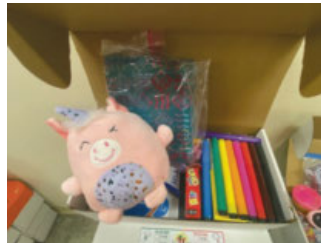
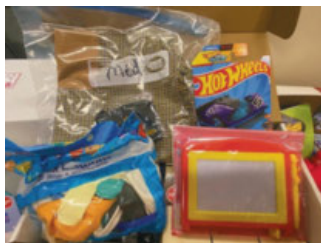
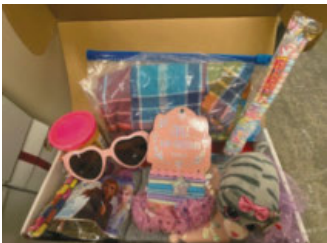
Following are guidelines for any damaged or worn liturgical items that are obviously beyond the ability to function worthily.

- If the item is burnable, it should be burned. If possible, the ashes should then be collected and buried on church grounds
 - If the item cannot be burned it should be disassembled or destroyed in a way that prevents any profane re-use and then buried on church grounds---not disposed of in a landfill. If the item is metal and could be melted-down for re-use it must first be disassembled or destroyed in a way that prevents any profane re-use in its recognizable form prior to its trip to the smelter.
- When attempting to burn sacred textiles and books:
- Using a hot fire already burning with its own fuel source is required.
 - It is best to throw any textile items on the already burning fire one-by-one, as some textiles are treated to specifically inhibit burning. (A thick pile of items thrown-on at once may not ignite and may even extinguish the fire.)
 - Stay away from the fumes given off by the burning textiles, as they may be somewhat toxic.

Hardcover books: Unless the covers are removed and the pages are torn from the binding of hardcover books prior to burning, the portions of the pages nearest the binding will most likely not ignite, even if the fire is extremely hot. This would necessitate any unburned/still recognizable portions, along with the ashes if possible, be collected and buried on church grounds.

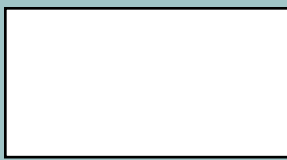
