Let us pray that nations move toward effective disarmament, particularly nuclear disarmament, and that world leaders choose the path of dialogue and diplomacy instead of violence.



Supporting Catholic Education at Kearney Catholic

Kearney Catholic High School is sustained through a partnership of families, parishes, and the broader community. Teacher salaries and insurance account for 68% of the operating budget. Since establishing the Annual Star Fund in 2022, teacher base salary has increased from 83.4% to 88.5% of Kearney Public Schools' base salary, helping strengthen stability in the classroom. This March, through Match Madness, a generous donor will match gifts dollar-for-dollar up to \$50,000 in support of teacher salaries. A successful campaign reduces tuition pressure by \$300 per student.

Do you have a green thumb or enjoy working on landscaping projects? The Prince of Peace Building and Grounds Committee is currently in search of a volunteer/s who would like to assume responsibility for our beautiful landscape. Duties would include seasonal maintenance of the flower beds and managing plans and updates to the surrounding grounds. This might be a great opportunity for a husband and wife team that enjoys outdoor activities such as this.

In addition, the committee is also searching for new members as we have several that have recently retired. If either of these opportunities sound interesting to you, please contact the office for further details.

You might be among those who say to themselves, "Why should I confess my sins to my fellow man? I would rather speak to God directly." Or you might be afraid to confess your sins to a priest. Or maybe someone has attacked you because of confessing to a priest?

WHAT IS PENANCE? Penance a sacrament by which sins committed after baptism are forgiven. A person confesses their sins to a priest, who then offers **absolution and guidance**.

EARLY CHURCH Confession was a private matter between an individual and God. The priest was not involved in the process. This practice was known as, "**auricular confession**," and was seen as a way to seek forgiveness and reconciliation with God.

MIDDLE AGES As the Church grew, the practice of auricular confession began to change. The Church began to emphasize the importance of confessing one's sins to a priest. **This was seen as a way to receive absolution and guidance from a spiritual authority.** The priest was seen as a **mediator between the individual and God.**

THE 16TH CENTURY The Council of Trent formalized the practice of confession that all Catholics must confess their sins to a priest at least once a year.

WHY THEN CONFESS TO A PRIEST? The first two chapters of **Baruch (1:13)** tell us how the Jewish exiles in ancient Babylon repented of the sins that had led to their humiliation by their enemies. These penitents confessed their sins to God and to the priests back in Jerusalem, asking the priests to intercede for them: *"Pray for us also to the LORD, our God, for we have sinned against the LORD."*

COMMAND FROM JESUS: Jesus showed that human nature could be used by God as an instrument of grace and forgiveness. He said, **"But that you may know that the Son of Man has the power to forgive sin..."** (Mt. 9:6; Mk 2:7-10; Lk 5:21-24). The Hebrew title He used was "**ben Adam**," meaning, "**Son of Adam.**" This was the Hebrew way of saying, "a human being." Jesus always gloried in His humanity, since through it He redeemed us. He communicated this authority to His Apostles on Easter night, *"Whose sins you shall forgive they are forgiven, whose sins you*

shall retain they are retained," (Jn 20:19-23). In this way, He gave the Apostles the power to give "Peace" (v.21), which is nothing less than the reconciliation of man with God.

IN CATHOLIC PRACTICE

The priest not only prays for the penitent but also imposes a penance (satisfaction) and speaks on God's behalf the words of forgiveness (absolution).

CHRISTIAN TRADITION & SCRIPTURE Jesus granted authority to St. Peter, the other apostles, and his ordained successors to forgive sins.: *"Whatever you bind [that is, by imposing penance] on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose [that is, forgive in God's name] on earth shall be loosed in heaven" (Mt 16:19; 18:18). "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained," (Mt 20:23).*

Catholics are obligated to repent of all mortal, or grave, sins (contrition) and to confess them to a priest in order to be absolved. The penitent performs the assigned penance to repair the harm caused by sin and to reestablish habits that lead to holiness. The absolution imparted by the priest is not a mere expression of hope, but a sacramental, objective reality.

N.B. *Always feel free wherever you find a priest to ask him for penance. Since we eat every day, our souls also need spiritual nourishment. Do not fear even if you do not know what to say just talk to a priest he will always guide you.*


