
Fr. Scott Harter



You might be wondering why the Gospel Book is lifted high and carried to the ambo before reading?

What are the books of the Gospel? The Book of the Gospels contains readings from the Gospels according to Mark, Matthew, Luke, and John. Selections from the four accounts of the Gospel are proclaimed over the three years of the Sunday and solemnity cycle of readings.

The Book of the Gospels is a symbol of our access to God, through Jesus the Christ and made possible by the power of the Holy Spirit. The Book is a symbol of Christ, who is present, speaking to this Christian community, at this time and in this place.

During the Entrance Procession, the vested deacon reverently carries the Book of the Gospels before him so that it may be seen by the faithful. With the priest, he makes the proper reverence and goes up to the altar, placing the Book of the Gospels on it. The deacon then kisses the altar at the same time as the priest. In the absence of a deacon, the reader reverently carries the Book of the Gospels in procession. The reader follows the acolytes and other ministers in procession. The reader places the Book of the Gospels on the altar, but the reader does not kiss the altar."

The Book of the Gospels contains not only the words of scripture, but is processed, incensed, and kissed because it is Christ who speaks when the scriptures are proclaimed in liturgy. The word "gospel" means "good news." The "good news" is not something, but someone. Jesus Christ is indeed good news. His words call us to listen, to hear, to take to heart the message, in order that we can be transformed by his very presence as the proclamation of his words, as good news, to a people who long for truth, goodness, and beauty.

During Mass, while singing the Alleluia, the priest or deacon lifts the Gospel Book high and carries it in procession to the ambo.

The Gospel is not just one reading among many. It is Christ Himself speaking to His people. By lifting the book, the

Church proclaims that the words about to be spoken come from above, not from human opinion or reflection.

This gesture mirrors ancient royal custom. When a king's message was carried into a city, it was lifted high so all could see. In the same way, the Gospel is elevated because the King is about to speak.



A Deep Eucharistic symbolism. Just as the Body of Christ is lifted on the altar, the Word of Christ is lifted in the assembly. The Church honors both with the same reverence, teaching that Christ is truly present in His Word and in the Sacrament.

The procession itself matters. The Gospel does not come quietly or privately. It moves through the people, reminding us that the Word of God is meant to be **heard, carried, and lived, not kept hidden.**

By incensing the Book of the Gospel, the meaning deepens, processing with it, and kissing it following the proclamation, the Church and minister is venerating or reverencing Christ himself, who is the word of God. When something is full of awe, it calls one to contemplate, to pay attention by focusing our senses on the person or thing. We begin to ask, "Why does this (person or object) move me?" The proclamation of God's very word, housed in the Book of the Gospels, should indeed be awesome. It should stir our being to pay attention, to contemplate the depth of meaning, and to live the Word of Christ in our daily life. We revere the Book of the Gospels because Christ is present in the proclamation of his words, calling us to live these words in our life.




