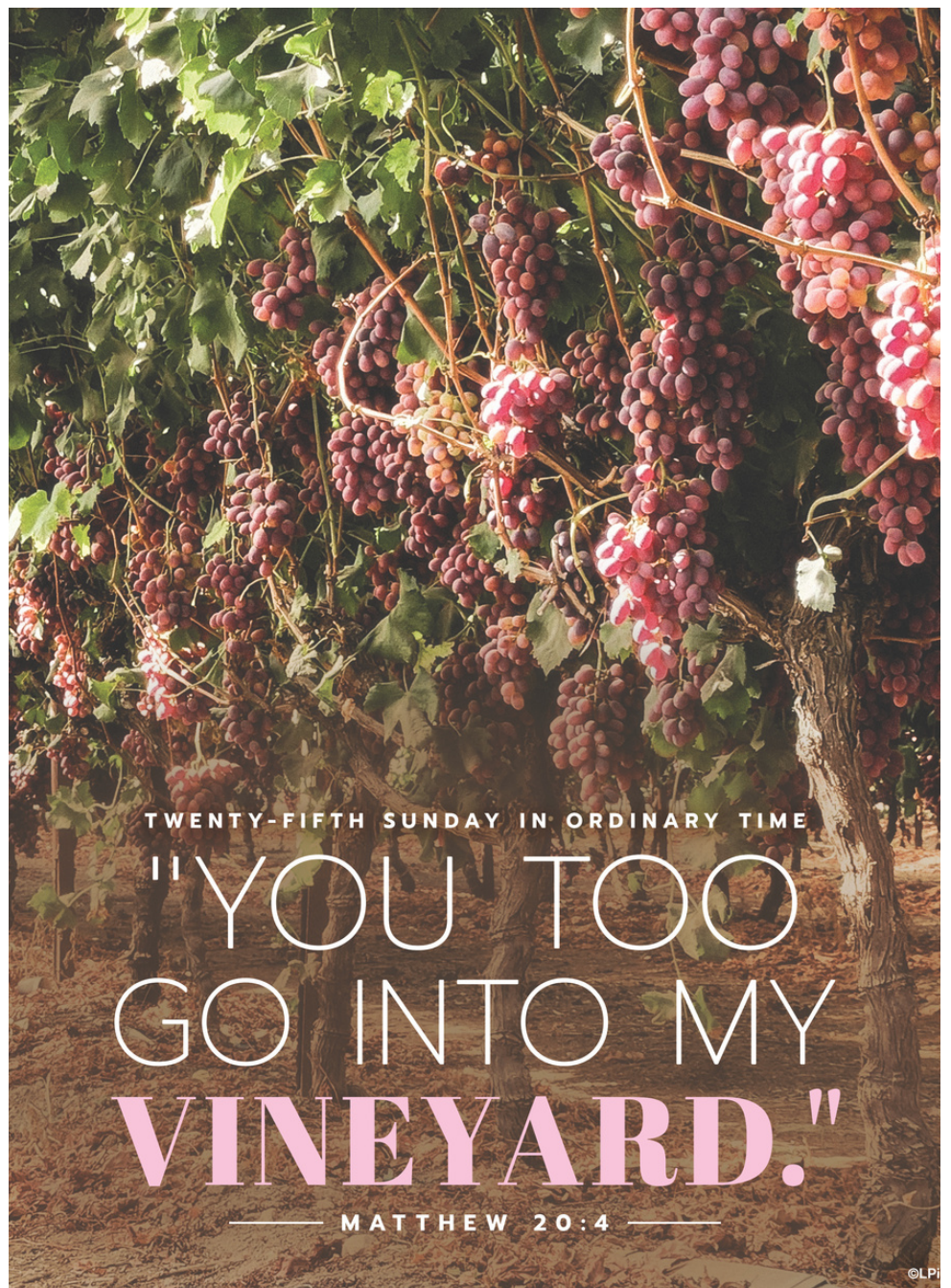
FR. SCOTT HARTER

Mortal Sins That Catholics May Already Know

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A mortal sin is a gravely serious sin committed with full knowledge of its seriousness and with deliberate consent. (CCC 1874, 1861) Some sins can look ordinary, become socially accepted, or even be joked about, while the Church actually considers their matter potentially grave.

For a sin to be mortal, three conditions must be present: **Grave matter, full knowledge and deliberate consent.** A mortal sin becomes one when one freely chose to do wrong out of his knowledge and understanding.

1. Deliberately Missing Sunday Mass Without a Serious Reason. The Church teaches that Catholics are obliged to participate in Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation unless excused for a serious reason. Deliberately missing Mass without a sufficient reason can constitute grave matter. (CCC 2180-2181) The elderly, the sick/ill and those like in hospice are always excused.

2. Receiving Holy Communion While Conscious of Mortal Sin. The Eucharist is the Body and Blood of Christ. The Church therefore calls a person conscious of mortal sin to receive sacramental absolution before receiving Communion, except under the circumstances provided by canon law. (CCC 1385; Canon 916)

3. Deliberately Destroying Someone's Reputation Through Serious Slander. Saying something false about another person can seriously damage their reputation, family, employment or relationships. The seriousness depends on what is said, why it is said and the harm caused. Serious calumny can therefore involve grave matter. (CCC 2477-2479)

4. Stealing Something of Serious Value. Stealing is not automatically mortal simply because it is stealing. But taking something that causes serious harm or involves significant value can constitute grave matter. The Church teaches that the seriousness of theft is measured partly by the harm done to the victim. (CCC 2408-2409)

5. Deliberately Exploiting or Defrauding Someone Financially. Cheating someone, manipulating a transaction or deliberately refusing to pay a just debt can become seriously sinful when substantial harm or injustice is involved. The Seventh Commandment requires respect for the property and rights of others. (CCC 2401-2412)

6. Serious Abuse of Alcohol or Drugs. The problem is not that every use of alcohol is sinful. But deliberately abusing substances to the point of seriously impairing reason, endangering oneself or others, or causing serious harm can involve grave matter. (CCC 2290)

7. Deliberately Endangering Another Person's Life. Reckless behavior is not merely "being careless" when it places another person's life in serious danger. Deliberately driving dangerously, handling dangerous situations irresponsibly or knowingly exposing others to serious risk can become gravely sinful. (CCC 2269)

8. Deliberately Consenting to Serious Sexual Sin. The Church teaches that sexual intimacy belongs within marriage. Certain sexual acts outside marriage can therefore involve grave matter. However, personal responsibility still depends upon knowledge and freedom; circumstances can sometimes diminish culpability. (CCC 2351-2357)

9. Deliberately Hating Someone and Seriously Desiring Their Grave Harm. Feeling anger is not automatically mortal sin. But deliberately choosing hatred and seriously willing grave harm against another person is a different matter. Jesus calls His followers to love even their enemies and reject hatred. (CCC 2302-2303)

N.B: If you become aware that you have committed a mortal sin, the Catholic response is not despair, but repentance.

First, acknowledge the sin honestly before God. Do not excuse it, but do not panic either. Second, make an act of contrition and resolve to turn away from the sin. Third, go to sacramental confession as soon as reasonably possible. Until reconciliation, you should not receive Holy Communion.

Mary's Journey - Theotokos

Mary's Pregnancy in weeks 25-27.



Baby may grow to about 15½ inches and weigh around three pounds. He will open his eyes and practice breathing and swallowing more. He may experience hiccups as his lungs continue to develop.



Baby's startle reflexes and muscle tone are developing. You may be able to hear His heartbeat by pressing your ear to Mary's stomach at 27 weeks.

Mary's hair may seem thick and lustrous because normal hair loss is suppressed by pregnancy hormones. She may also experience mild swelling in extremities and should avoid sitting or standing for long periods of time and should stay hydrated.
