

Taizé Prayer Service

A Taizé prayer service is a peaceful, contemplative gathering featuring simple, repetitive songs (chants), Scripture readings, and long periods of silence, designed to foster a meditative encounter with God through simplicity and community.

St. Teresa of Calcutta Newman Center will be praying the Stations of the Cross every Friday during Lent. These will be walking stations done at the building site for the new church, 1601 University Drive. These will begin at approximately 1 pm, when Father returns from Mass at Mount Carmel Home. All are welcome to join them in the Lenten prayer.

Supporting Catholic Education at Kearney Catholic

Kearney Catholic High School is sustained through a partnership of families, parishes, and the broader community. Teacher salaries and insurance account for 68% of the operating budget. Since establishing the Annual Star Fund in 2022, teacher base salary has increased from 83.4% to 88.5% of Kearney Public Schools' base salary, helping strengthen stability in the classroom. This March, through Match Madness, a generous donor will match gifts dollar-for-dollar up to \$50,000 in support of teacher salaries. A successful campaign reduces tuition pressure by \$300 per student.

COMING LATE FOR MASS & LEAVING BEFORE THE END OF MASS.

Have you ever noticed people coming after Mass has started and some leaving before the final blessing? Some people are already at the gate before a priest says that the Mass has ended, and some even go immediately after receiving Holy Communion. *(If we are invited into the presence of a president, a queen or the pope, wouldn't we arrive before the dignitary and stay until the function is complete? What if Jesus asked us to attend the Last Supper; would we come late or leave before the meal was over?)* **Doesn't God, who created us, who gave his life for us, deserve the same respect?** Then why go late for Mass and leave early before the final blessing? **You might be missing something!!**

When does Mass begin? According to General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) sec. 46, Holy Mass commences with the entrance by priests and ministers accompanied by chant or a hymn, if present.

When does Mass end? The Concluding Rites finish with the Dismissal, **"Go in peace."** (GIRM sec. 90).

The **Catechism of the Catholic Church, Constitution** of the Sacred Liturgy, & **canon law** obliges every catholic to attend the Holy Mass on Sunday and other days of obligation. **Participation does not mean we get to pick and choose in which parts of the Mass we wish to participate and by leaving early, we are not participating in the full Mass.**

What do you miss when you leave early? We are depriving ourselves of amazing **opportunities for grace.** After receiving the Holy Eucharist, we pause, kneel, and meditate in silence on what we just received in the Word and the Flesh of our Lord, Jesus Christ.

Our mission: Having heard the Word of the Lord and having come face to face with our Lord in the form of the Holy Eucharist, we now carry a great responsibility to take what we have just experienced out into the world. We are given a mission, and if we miss it, we will miss the graces that would come of it.

The Judas Move: At the very first Mass (the Last Supper in the Gospel of John), as Jesus talked about who was to betray him, the 12 started arguing among themselves asking, **"Master, who is it?"** In reply, Jesus said, **"It is the one to whom I hand the morsel,"** and, after dipping it, **he handed**

it to Judas. Judas took the morsel and left at once. Judas was the first to leave Mass early. Please don't misunderstand. I am not saying that anyone who leaves right after Eucharist is like Judas and betraying Jesus. What I am saying, is that we must be mindful of whom our actions emulate either deliberately or not.



What to do when arriving early before Mass: This is a time of personal preparation to meet God in the Eucharist. Likewise, the **time after participation** in Holy Communion is a special period of reflection. We have just received the body and blood of Christ and to **simply walk out makes a mockery of this glorious treasure.**

A tale: There is a story I heard about a priest who had the same problem with one of his devout parishioners who attended daily Mass but left immediately after Communion. He solved the problem by ordering two altar boys with lighted tapers to walk on either side of him as soon as he started to leave the church and accompany him all the way to his carriage. When, after three days repeating this action, the somewhat flustered and embarrassed gentleman asked the priest for an explanation, he was told that since Christ was still present in him as he left the church, his presence had to be honored by lighted candles. Needless to say, he never left early again.

There are conditions under which one may need to leave Mass early, e.g. in sickness and emergencies but it should be a serious reason.

The priests in our dioceses are so kind and lovingly want to remind all parishioners about our faith. Let us love our faith and what we believe in, and let us teach it to our children.
