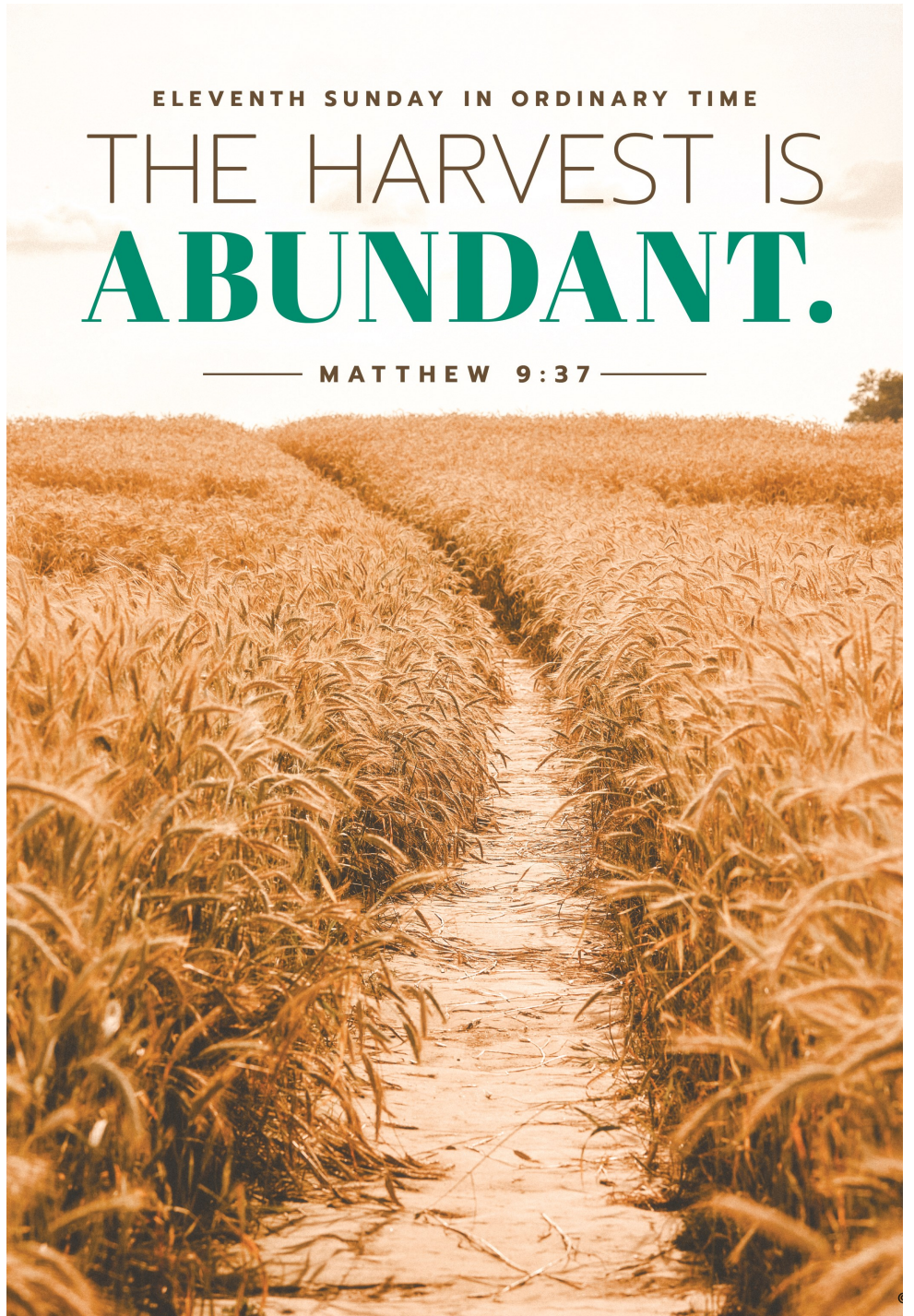
Fr. Lawrence Kawagga was ordained a priest in 2024 and became associate pastor of Prince of Peace in 2025.

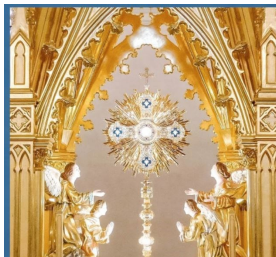
The passing of Saint Francis of Assisi, whose eighth centenary is being celebrated this year

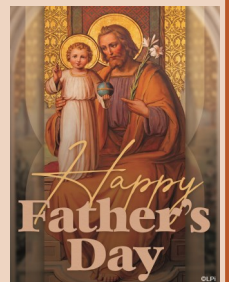

The tabernacle is the place where the Blessed Sacrament is kept.

According to the **Hebrew Bible**, it is referred to as a **'residence, dwelling place', Tent of the Congregation or a Tent of Meeting**. Moses was instructed at Mount Sinai to construct and transport the tabernacle with the Israelites on their journey through the wilderness and their subsequent conquest of the Promised Land. (1 Kings 6:1) Exodus chapters 25–27, 35–40, refers to an **inner shrine**, the **Holy of Holies**. Exodus 25:8-9 states, ***"Then have them make a sanctuary for Me, so that I may dwell among them."***

The Tabernacle was constructed using materials contributed by the Israelites, including gold, silver, bronze, fine linen, and acacia wood.

MARY AS THE ARK OF THE NEW COVENANT: In the Catholic teaching, Mary is called the Ark of the New Covenant because she is the living vessel in whom the Lord dwells, fulfilling the Old Testament role of the Ark of the Covenant.

Mary's Role: Just as the Ark held God's presence, Mary held the Word made flesh (Jesus) in her womb. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states: ***"Mary, in whom the Lord himself has just made his dwelling, is the daughter of Zion in person, the ark of the covenant, the place where the glory of the Lord dwells."*** (CCC 2676)

Early Church Fathers like St. Ephrem, St. Proclus, and St. Athanasius saw Mary as the fulfillment of Old Testament types, such as the Ark, the tabernacle, and the vessel of God's Word.

FUNCTION AND SIGNIFICANCE:

The Tabernacle served as the focal point of Israelite worship and the place where God met with His people. It was the center of sacrificial offerings and the location where the high priest would enter the Most Holy Place once each year on the Day of Atonement to make atonement for the sins of the nation (Leviticus 16).

THEOLOGICAL IMPLICATIONS

It represents God's desire to dwell among His people and foreshadows the coming of Jesus Christ, who is described in the **New Testament as the true Tabernacle**. John 1:14 states, ***"The Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us."*** ***Today Christ lies in the tabernacle in the form of the blessed sacrament, he is there in the consecrated Holy Eucharist.***

IN THE EARLY CHURCH, The Blessed Sacrament was kept in a cabinet in the sacristy. In many churches, it was placed on the high altar. However, in cathedrals and monastic churches, it was placed on the altar of a special side chapel, the Chapel of the Blessed Sacrament. **This was done to allow for special veneration** of the Blessed Sacrament and to provide a way to distribute Communion without disrupting

the solemn celebrations taking place at the high altar.

The norms **stipulate that the Eucharist must be reserved in the cathedral and in parish churches**, and, with the **bishop's permission**, may be reserved in other churches, oratories, and chapels (**CIC, can. 934**). In places where it is reserved, Holy Mass must be **celebrated at least twice a month** to renew the Eucharist (CIC, c. 934). **Furthermore**, churches where the Blessed Sacrament is reserved must be open for a few hours each day so that the faithful may pray (CIC, c. 937). ***This must be placed "in the most prominent part of the church, distinguished, visible, beautifully adorned, and suitable for prayer"*** (CIC, 938, and IGMR, n. 314).

The tabernacle must be **blessed before use** (IGMR n. 314), **immovable, made of solid, non-transparent material, and locked in such a way as to minimize the risk of desecration.** (CIC, c. 938).

A lamp fueled by oil or wax must be lit indicating that the blessed sacrament is present in the tabernacle (CIC, can. 940 and IGMR n. 316).

A canopy may be used for this same purpose. The canopy is a veil that covers the tabernacle where the Eucharist is reserved. ***It must be the liturgical color proper for the day, except black.*** If the Blessed Sacrament is removed, the canopy is taken down or lifted. The conopeum is a sign of the tent of the tabernacle of the Ark of the Covenant.

Every part of the Tabernacle foreshadowed Jesus' role in our salvation. He is:

- ✓ The dwelling place of God (John 1:14)
- ✓ The bread that satisfies (John 6:35)
- ✓ The light that guides (John 8:12)
- ✓ The sacrifice that saves (John 1:29)
- ✓ The intercessor who prays for us (Hebrews 7:25)

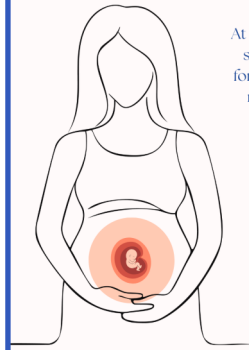

Mary's Pregnancy in weeks 13-15.



At Mary's ultrasound she may be able to find out that she is having a boy. His vocal cords are starting to form, preparing him for crying and cooing. His facial muscles can be used now to grimace and smile.



During these weeks Baby will grow from 3 inches to around 4 inches. Week 14 starts Mary's second trimester. At 15 weeks He will be the size of a pear.

Mary may start feeling less nauseous, find it hard to remember things, or easily catch a cold or infection. She also may be starting to show she is pregnant.

Keeping track of things on a calendar or phone can help Mary stay organized and less forgetful. Carrying hand sanitizer and washing her hands often will help her stay healthy.

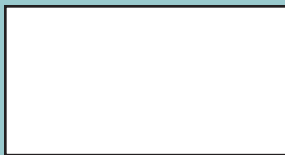
