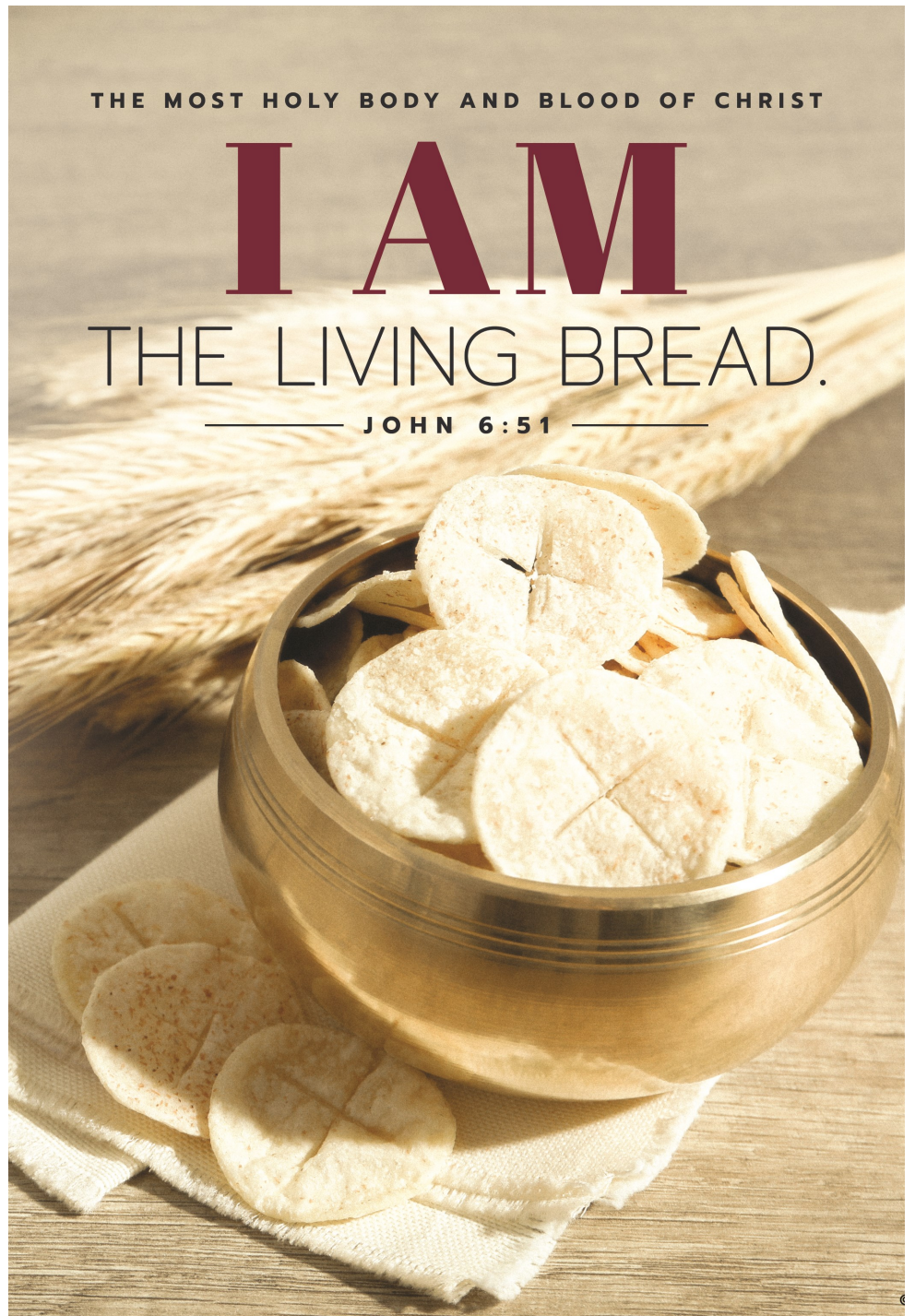

How Is the Way I Dress Related to the Worship of God?

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

I know this is a sensitive topic, but I invite you to read this message with an open heart, for it is written for the salvation of souls.

Many questions are often raised: *“Father, do you not see how people dress in church today? Why do some come to Mass dressed as if they are going to the beach, a bar, or walking carelessly on the street? Is God pleased with this? Are people unable to afford more respectful clothing for church?”* Sadly, in our time, many people have become too casual in the way they dress for Holy Mass. Father Paskert once stated: *“The fact is God became incarnate; God, who is Spirit, became flesh and dwelt among us. That mystery gives significance to external things. What we do as spiritual people is expressed in our bodies, in the things we do, and in how we dress. Showing reverence and honor to God through the way we present ourselves is no different.”*

Is There a Written Dress Code in the Catholic Church?

The Catholic Church does not have a formal written dress code that dictates exactly how the faithful must dress when attending church functions. However, there is an unwritten expectation of modesty, reverence, and dignity when entering into the Real Presence of Our Lord Jesus Christ. Those who recognize the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist naturally desire to offer their best to the Lord. Proper dress reflects self-respect, reverence, and love for God. On the other hand, when Holy Mass is treated merely as a social gathering, the sacredness of God’s house can easily be forgotten.

The Parable of the Wedding Banquet

Jesus Himself spoke about proper attire in the parable of the wedding feast: *“But when the king came in to see the guests, he noticed a man there who was not wearing wedding clothes. ‘Friend,’ he asked, ‘how did you get in here without wedding clothes?’ The man was speechless. Then the king told the attendants, ‘Tie him hand and foot, and throw him outside, into the darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.’ For many are invited, but few are chosen.”* -Matthew 22:11-14

No one is going to throw you out of church because of your clothing, but we are all called to present ourselves before God with reverence and dignity.

A Personal Choice

The truth is that we freely choose what we wear. When people attend Holy Mass dressed immodestly or inappropriately, it can become a scandal to others. It may distract the faithful, diminish reverence, and even lead others into temptation or unnecessary thoughts that take their focus away from God.

Respect for the House of God

Imagine if a bishop or priest came to celebrate Mass wearing shorts, a tank top, and flip-flops. Most people would immediately object. So why should there be a different standard for the laity? Yes, priests wear prescribed liturgical vestments because of their sacred ministry, but all the baptized share in the common priesthood of Christ. Therefore, everyone should show respect for God’s house through appropriate and reverent attire- not as if attending a picnic, sporting event, or swimming pool. A church is not a swimming pool.



What the Catechism Says

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* teaches: *“To prepare for worthy reception of this sacrament, the faithful should observe the fast required in their Church. Bodily demeanor (gestures, clothing) ought to convey the respect, solemnity, and joy of this moment when Christ becomes our guest.”* - CCC 1387

St. Peter’s Basilica Dress Code

Even at St. Peter’s Basilica in Rome, modest dress is required for both men and women. During Mass and visits to the Basilica, shoulders and knees must be covered. Men are expected to remove hats before entering the church. This practice reminds us that sacred places deserve sacred respect.

Emergencies and Special Situations

Of course, there are exceptional circumstances. If someone is traveling, facing an emergency, or unexpectedly unable to change clothes before Mass, God understands. In such situations, the priority is to attend Mass and worship the Lord. The issue is not occasional necessity, but habitual carelessness toward the sacredness of worship.

What You Wear Reflects Who You Are

Often, people are identified by the way they present themselves. A gentleman or a lady is recognized not only by words, but also by conduct and appearance. As Scripture says: *“It is not what goes into the mouth that defiles a person, but what comes out of the mouth.”* -Matthew 15:11 While holiness begins in the heart, outward appearance can still express inward reverence and dignity.

A Responsibility Toward Children

Children learn by observing their parents and elders. What we teach them today shapes the way they will worship tomorrow. Jesus warned: *“But whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him to have a great millstone fastened around his neck and to be drowned in the depth of the sea.”* -Matthew 18

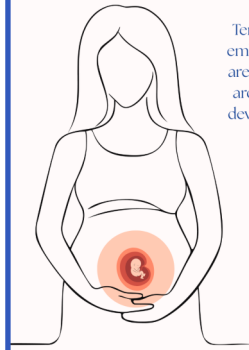

Mary's Journey - Theotokos

Mary's Pregnancy in weeks 10-12.



Terms used for Baby's development change from an embryo to a fetus. At 12 weeks most of Baby's systems are fully formed. The average heart rate at this time is around 150 to 170 bpm. Fingers and toes continue to develop and nails start to form. His bones are starting to form and His muscles start to develop.

Baby grows another inch during these three weeks and will be around the size of a lime by 12 weeks.



Mary may be feeling more tired, may have heartburn and indigestion or experience occasional headaches or dizziness.

Getting some exercise, using pillows to stay elevated while sleeping, and using a cold compress could help alleviate Mary's symptoms.

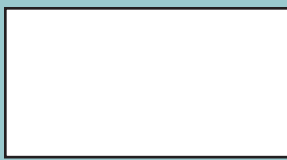
