Take a look at what we're learning

Sacrament: A holy, visible sign instituted by Christ of an invisible reality. There are 7: baptism, reconciliation, Eucharist, matrimony, confirmation, holy orders, and anointing of the sick (YouCat 172-178)

Grace: The life of God in our souls; received through sacraments, prayer, and by doing good works. (YouCat 338-340)

<u>Baptism</u>: the sacrament which takes away original sin, gives us grace and makes us children of God. (YouCat 194-202)

<u>Prophet</u>: a person who prepared the people for the coming of the Savior. (YouCat 8)

Covenant: a promise or agreement between 2 or more persons. God made a covenant with Noah and Abraham.

QUESTIONS TO DISCUSS WITH YOUR CHILD

- 1. How do we get rid of original sin? Through Baptism
- 2. What are the words of baptism? I baptize you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen
- 3. Who built the ark? Why? Noah, because God planned to flood the earth and asked Noah to build the ark
- 4. What does the sacrament of Baptism do? Takes away original sin, gives us grace, makes us children of God
- 5. What is grace and how do we receive it? God's life in our souls; through the sacraments, prayer and good deeds.
- 6. Name the 7 sacraments. *Baptism, reconciliation, Eucharist, confirmation, matrimony, holy orders, anointing of sick*
- 7. Tell me about Joseph. *He was the son of Jacob, had 11 brothers who disliked him and sold him into slavery*
- 8. Who was Moses? a Hebrew slave that God spoke to through a burning bush. He freed the Israelites from Egypt after the 10 plagues, started Passover, parted the red sea, received the 10 commandments and led the people to the Promised Land.
- 9. What is a prophet supposed to do? *To remind the people of their promises with God and to tell them to turn away from their sinful ways.*
- 10. Name 2 or 3 prophets. Jeremiah, Isaiah, John the Baptist, Daniel, Ezekiel, . . .

Feast of All Saints Day

All Saints' Day is a solemn holy day of the Catholic Church celebrated annually on November 1. The day is dedicated to the saints of the Church, that is, all those who have attained heaven. It should not be confused with All Souls' Day, which is observed on November 2, and is dedicated to those who have died and not yet reached heaven.

Generally, All Saints' Day is a Catholic Holy Day of Obligation, meaning all Catholics are required to attend Mass on that day, unless they have an excellent excuse, such as serious illness.

Other countries have different rules according to their national bishop's conferences. The bishops of each conference have the authority to amend the rules surrounding the obligation of the day.

Saint Elizabeth of Hungary (1207-1231) devoted her life and her financial resources to the improvement of the lives of the sick and poor. The daughter of the King of Hungary, she renounced her privileged life and worked to serve the less fortunate, creating such charitable institutions as a hospital for lepers and the first orphanage in Central Europe.
