These protocols are in place to assist us in providing the safest environment possible.

When you are not able to social distance please wear a mask

Do not expect our church to be any safer than other public spaces.

The D.H.H.S.¹ as of June 19, 2020 issued the following guidelines:

The following people are encouraged to stay home:

- The elderly
- People with underlying medical conditions
- Family members who live with elderly people or those who are at risk
- People who have access to those at risk in nursing institutions

The following people are asked to stay home:

- People who have upper respiratory or flu-like symptoms
- People who live with someone with upper respiratory or flu-like symptoms
- People with COVID-19 or live with someone with COVID-19
- People who have been exposed to someone with COVID-19

GENERAL INFORMATION TO KNOW BEFORE ATTENDING MASS

*Some of these guidelines may push your comfort level or personal beliefs
but we would be so much obliged if you would follow them.*

- ❖ **Patience:** This is uncharted territory for us. We all will be asked to accommodate and adapt to the extra cautions and protections that will be put in place. ***These sacrifices are in the best interests of us all.***
- ❖ The Weekend Mass schedule remains the same: Saturday at 5 pm; Sunday 8 am and 10:30 am.
- ❖ Wednesday Mass at 6:00 pm: the wearing of Masks required.
- ❖ There will be weekday Masses Tuesday and Friday at 7:30 am, Thursday at 12:05 pm.
- ❖ The Sacrament of Reconciliation will be offered Wednesday from 5 pm to 5:30 pm;
Saturdays from 4 pm to 4:30 pm.
- ❖ Please maintain appropriate social distancing between parties. A “party” should be understood to include members of a household or family and therefore may be seated together in the house of worship, but should maintain six (6) feet of social distance from other parties.
- ❖ All those attending should use facial coverings, especially when maintaining appropriate social distancing is not possible. Please do so when in the communion line.
- ❖ **Please sanitize your area with the products provide in the blue buckets before you leave.**

PROCEDURES FOR ATTENDING MASS

- ❖ Everyone is expected to wear a mask (masks are available for you at the doors if you don't have one).
- ❖ Continue the 6-foot distancing rule when entering into the church.
- ❖ You may enter any entrance door you would like; please use the sanitation gel before you go to the pew

- ❖ The restrooms are available for you at your own risk. Please use the restroom before you come to church.
- ❖ Pick up a bulletin at the door. It contains the worship aids (scripture, music, and mass parts).
- ❖ Use the 6-foot distancing rule; every other pew will be used. The pews will be marked to allow you to visualize the 6 foot sections. Saturday 5 pm and Sunday 10:30 am use the pews with beige masking tape. Sunday 8 am please use the pews marked with the blue masking tape.
- ❖ Please move accordingly in the pew accommodate those arriving late.
- ❖ The greeters are available answer any questions.
- ❖ There will be baskets near the doors for your offering, since we won't be passing the offering basket, or you may take advantage of the on-line giving.
- ❖ If you choose to hold hands during the Our Father, you may do so only with your family.
- ❖ The Sign of Peace will only be done with your family. You may give a symbol of peace or a wave to those around you if you choose.

PROCEDURES FOR RECEIVING COMMUNION

- ❖ Please wear a mask when receiving communion. If you desire to receive communion on the tongue, please wait in order that you will be last in the communion line.
- ❖ Use the 6-foot distancing rule when making the communion line (families may go up together and thus be closer to each other).
- ❖ The side aisles will be used for returning to your pew.
- ❖ Those sitting in the north or south transepts will receive directions specific for your location when you are in church.

PROCEDURES FOR DISMISSAL

- ❖ As you leave church, please continue to practice social distancing.
- ❖ There are baskets near the entrance of the church for your offerings.
- ❖ There are bulletins available to pick up or you may choose to read it on line.
- ❖ There are waste containers provided near the doors for your use.
- ❖ Go to your vehicles immediately after Mass.
- ❖ You are discouraged from congregating in the parking lot after Mass.
