- Mike: Budget came in high at \$4.3M; cut over \$1M. Total cost currently is \$3.4M. Have \$2.4M already. Probably going to have to borrow about \$500,000.

- Break ground in the spring. Will still have west access through most of the build.

- C. Eucharistic Revival: Teaching Dies Domini (The Lord's Day) Bishop will reflect upon this Apostolic Letter during this Diocesan Year of the Eucharistic Revival. He is making live-streamed presentations on Dies Domini on Monday evenings: December 5 and 12, mostly during the Advent season. Presentations will begin at 7:30PM Central Time. - June 8th Corpus Christi Kick off in North Plate on the Saturday of Corpus Christi to kick-off parish year
 - Bishop is suggesting that Saturday night masses that weekend be canceled and could possibly be replaced with a Sunday night mass
- DCCW would like to bring the Eucharistic miracle board to the parishes in September and October 2023
- 2025: proposed 1 year of 'Going on Mission up to Pentecost 2025

Finance report

Pillars campaign

- 308 families that have donated toward the campaign
- \$2,461,361.52 has been pledged
- \$1,342,279.75 has been collected
 - o \$400,000.00 in savings at the Diocese earning 2%.
 - o \$350,000.00 is in CDs through Edward Jones earning 3.1%. No fees.
 - o The rest is in an interest-bearing account locally.

Campaign calls are being made by volunteers as a follow up to last letter that was sent early in November. Several new pledge cards have been turned in and some volunteers have completed their calls.

Collections: weekly budget is set at \$17,500 for 2022-23 fiscal year.

The parish came close to making budget in November. Usually, the first quarter in a parish, the budget is not made. The second quarter, which includes Christmas and year end giving, the budget is met for the first 6 months. The budget is divided equally for the weeks of the year, however, some of the larger bills come at different times. Also, Fr. Paul and the staff watch their spending carefully and have not spent more than what has been collected.
