Faith Formation Saint Stroll

The Saints strolled through the parish hall again this year, greeting children of all ages and faith formation students in grades K-5. Older faith formation students and adult volunteers took on the roles of Saints chosen by Faith Formation Coordinator Amy Lowe. Other volunteers took small groups to each "Saint" who then told the students about his or her life. After each talk, Saints gave out "treats" that would serve as a reminder about them. Treats ranging from candy to small Saint statuettes included toy flutes from St. Cecilia (patron Saint of musicians), caramel apple lollipops from St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (patron Saint of teachers), and a statuette of Our Lady of Guadalupe from St. Juan Diego.






She feels so grateful to all the parishioners at Prince of Peace who kept the church building going for all her years of absence. Helen Albrecht is our full time Administrative Assistant and bulletin editor in the parish office. A Kearney native, she was raised Catholic and after graduating from Kearney Catholic High School, she attended UNK. During these years, she left the Church and spent the next couple of decades swept away by the New Age movement. Feeling the call of the Holy Spirit, she

returned to the Catholic Church bringing along her husband, Marc, and three kids (Isaac, Elaine, and Benjamin). Today she is thrilled to be a revert to Catholicism and to be a part of such a dynamic church at Prince of Peace. She continues to do her best to answer God's calls and one of these was to assist in the church office and give back to the parish.

THRIVING. Prince of Peace is a vibrant parish. With 40 new families, 14 marriages and 39 baptisms in 2022-2023, the parish family is growing. This year, 26 children received First Communion, 20 young people were Confirmed in the faith, and 7 adults joined the church through O.C.I.A. Fr. Paul officiated at 13 funerals giving comfort to the grieving. Our parish hosted several social events including brunches, soup dinners, hot dog meals, the Platte River Singers winter concert, the St. John's Boys' Choir, and the annual SpringFest. Liturgy committee organized Blue Christmas and Advent and Lent retreats for the people. Stewardship committee and Faith Formation organized the Fall Kick-off and many parishioners are active in Pro-Life events.





SHARING. The Kindergarten through Fifth grade Faith Formation touches all ages of our parish:


"The kids really tricked me with the last trivia question from class, but I will never forget what we celebrate on the Immaculate Conception as we move forward." - dad of a student.




TEACHING. Troy and Carrie were apprehensive as they made the move from Hastings to Kearney, in 2021. Clay, their son, was going to start his sophomore year in a new high school. Thankful-

ly, that transition went smoothly! Not only did their son find a great group of friends, but there was also a caring faculty and staff, and Jesus Christ. Clay and all the students at KCHS encounter Christ daily in theology, morning and afternoon prayer, and weekly in Eucharist Adoration and Mass. All of these factors contributed to Clay's decision to become an Eucharistic minister. The Rasmussens are so thankful for the generous support of Prince of Peace Parishioners so the Catholic Church's evangelizing mission can be carried out at KCHS.



MINISTERING. In addition to Helen at the front desk, Prince of Peace is blessed with other full and part-time dedicated staff members who support Fr. Paul in ministering to the parish people. Lydia assists in reception and prepares for Masses each week. Makalya coordinates the Edge, Life Teen, Young adults and Young couples groups. Amy



coordinates the Kindergarten—Fifth grade program. Kathy W. ensures that the homebound receive communion, and runs the OCIA program as well as other small group studies. Mandy manages the office, the staff, many parish projects as well as produces PeaceTimes. Cecilia handles the finances of the parish. Tiffany coordinates the ministers schedule, weddings as well as other volunteer activities. Kathy N. makes sure the music at Masses is connected to the readings and sounds beautiful. Danny and DeAnn are the team that keeps the building clean and well maintained. Since there is only one priest and no pastoral nun, Fr. Paul depends greatly on the staff which allows his focus to remain on ministering to the people.




