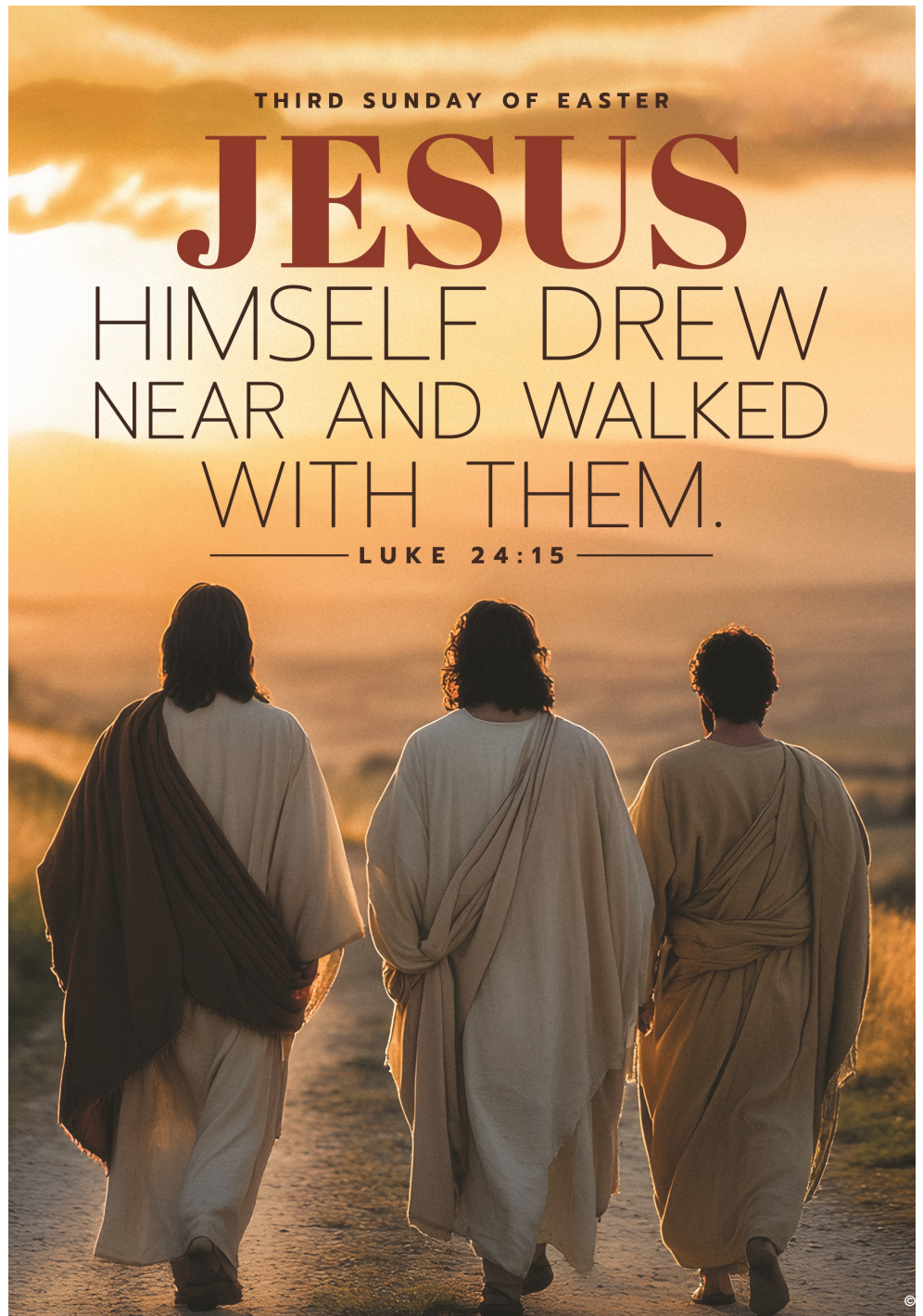
Fr. Scott Harter

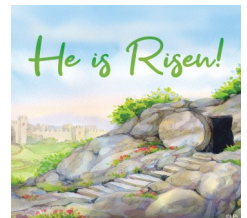

We'll explore the heart of the ancient world—walking through places where Scripture comes alive, visiting iconic ruins, breathtaking landscapes, and vibrant cities.

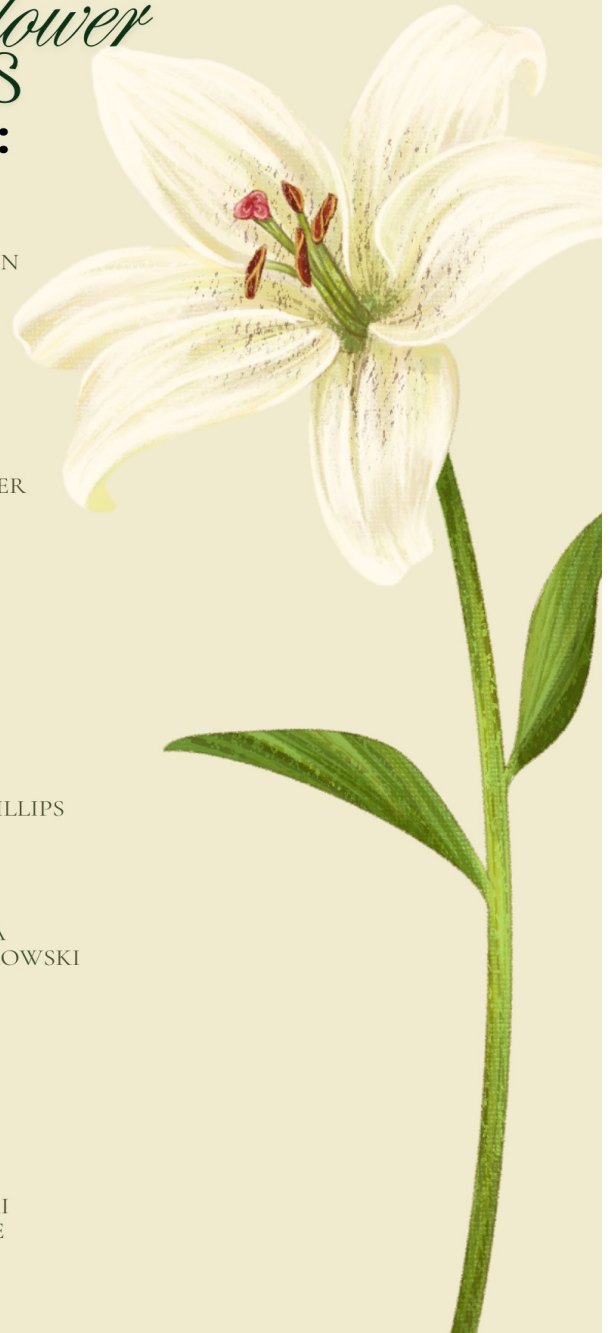

KNOW YOUR Faith: INCENSE IN THE LITURGY. WHY THAT SMOKE IN THE CHURCH!!!

At Mass and other liturgical services, priests and altar servers swing censers that send clouds of incense wafting through the air. You might have noticed, a priest incenses the Altar, the Easter candle, the priest is incensed, the deacon, the book of the gospel and the congregation. **The question is why? Everything** in Catholic liturgies symbolizes a theological truth; nothing is "just for show."

WHAT DOES INCENSE SYMBOLIZE IN CHRISTIAN LITURGY?

The smoke of incense is symbolic of sanctification and purification. It also symbolizes the prayers of the faithful.

It is an outward sign of spiritual realities, which is why it has its place in Christian liturgy.

"Prayer itself purifies and sanctifies us, making us worthy of worshipping God in heaven for all eternity with the angels and saints."

Before we can dwell with God in eternity, there is need for our purification and sanctification-the removal of sin.

Incense makes our prayer a spiritual Aroma rising up to God. Psalm 141:2, says "Let my prayer be counted as incense before thee, and the lifting up of my hands as an evening sacrifice! & Sirach 39: 13-14 says; Listen to me, O you holy sons, and bud like a rose growing by a stream of water; send forth fragrance like frankincense, and put forth blossoms like a lily. Scatter the fragrance, and sing a hymn of praise; bless the Lord for all his works."

INCENSE IN THE OLD TESTAMENT

Incense has been used in Christian liturgy from its earliest days. A tradition that was commanded by God Himself and recorded in Sacred Scripture. For example, God commanded **Moses to make an Altar of Incense** for worship. **(You shall make an altar to burn incense upon. . . And Aaron shall burn fragrant incense on it; every morning when he dresses the lamps he shall burn it, and when Aaron sets up the lamps in the evening, he shall burn it, a perpetual incense before the Lord THROUGHOUT YOUR GENERATIONS. Exodus 30:1-10**

HOW INCENSE IS MADE? God gave instruction on how the incense should be made through a "holy recipe": **And the Lord said to Moses, "Take sweet spices, stacte, and onycha, and galbanum, sweet spices with pure frankincense (of each shall there be an equal part), and make an incense blended as by the perfumer, seasoned with salt, pure and holy; and you shall beat some of it very small, and put part of it before the testimony in the tent of meeting where I shall meet with you; it shall be for you most holy. And the incense which you shall make according to its composition, you shall not make for yourselves; it shall be for you holy to the Lord. Whoever makes any like it to use as perfume shall be cut off from his people."** Exodus 30:34-38

CLEANSING AND PURIFICATION: It was for cleansing and purification of the sacred space of the Tabernacle, making it a worthy

place for the worship of God according to His divine terms.

God gave these specific instructions to Moses because worship on earth was intended to be united with the worship taking place in heaven.

INCENSE IN THE NEW TESTAMENT

Frankincense was one of the precious gifts brought by the **Three Kings** to the **Baby Jesus**—a sign of **His role as priest in addition to His roles as prophet and king.** (Matthew 2:11.)

GODS' TRANSCENDENCE: Incense reminds us that God Transcends, Beyond our comprehension and yet imminent, close to us. As we watch the smoke rise, we are invited to lift our gaze and our hearts upward, leaving earthly distractions.

A BRIDGE BETWEEN EARTH AND HEAVEN. Our prayer rising to God: Incense is added to the prayers of the saints by an angel, highlighting the mediation of the angels in our worship of God: **"And another angel came and stood at the altar with a golden censer; and he was given much incense to mingle with the prayers of all the saints upon the golden altar before the throne; and the smoke of the incense rose with the prayers of the saints from the hand of the angel before God."** Rev, 8:3.

When we see incense at Mass, it reminds us of heaven and that our worship of God in the Christian liturgy is divine in origin. **Incense also reminds us that our prayer rises to God like the smoke from the censer, purifying our worship of Him, and allowing the Holy Spirit to work in us and make us holy.**

A SENSE OF SOLEMNITY & MYSTERY. The usage of incense adds a sense of solemnity and mystery to the Mass. The visual imagery of the smoke and the smell remind us of the transcendence of the Mass which links heaven with earth, and allow us to enter into the presence of God."

WHY THEN INCENSING THE PRIEST AND THE PUBLIC? As incense fills the space, it unites everyone in an atmosphere of worship. In a world where individuality often isolates us, incense reminds us that we are part of something greater. The church is the body of Christ.

Burning incense symbolizes our own lives offered to God. Just as incense is consumed by fire, we are called to surrender all that we are to the Lord, including in our struggles and sufferings. We are a living sacrifice according to St Paul (Romans 12:1)

INCENSE IN DAILY LIFE: we can incorporate incense into our personal prayer to enrich our spiritual life. Burning incense during prayer can help create a sacred space at Home, a Place where we can focus entirely on God. **In a secularized world,** we need a constant reminder of God's presence. Having a small censer at home or in a workspace can be visual and a sign of our connection with the divine.

Mary's Pregnancy in weeks 3-6.





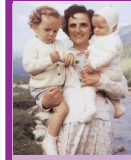
The baby's fingers and toes begin to form, and facial features including the nostril, ears, and jaws begin to take shape.

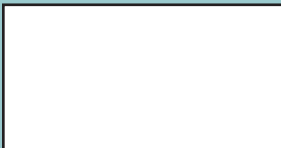
