
Fr. Scott Harter



BODY OR BLOOD ONLY? Is it a “must” to receive the Body and Blood of Jesus?

As Catholics, we fully participate in the celebration of the Eucharist when we receive Holy Communion. We are encouraged to receive Communion devoutly and frequently. In order to be properly disposed to receive Communion, one who is conscious of grave sin is not to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord without prior sacramental confession. In this case, the person is to be mindful of the obligation to make an act of perfect contrition, including the intention of confessing as soon as possible (**Canon 916**).

The **Council of Trent teaches** that, Christ is fully present under **both species**. Christ is "truly, really, and substantially contained" in Holy Communion. His presence is not momentary nor simply signified, but wholly and permanently real **under each of the consecrated species of bread and wine**. This means that when you receive the **Sacred Host alone, you receive the whole of Christ, not half of Him**. Jesus Himself assures us, “He who eats this bread will live forever.” **John 6:58**

The priest receives under both species because of his role: At Mass, the priest acts in persona Christi (in the person of Christ). By receiving both the Body and the Blood, he visibly completes the sacramental sign of the sacrifice Christ instituted at the Last Supper.

The Church has the authority to regulate Communion: "The most Holy Eucharist is to be given only under the form of bread." (**1917 Code of Canon Law**)

Practical reasons also matter. Avoiding abuses of the Holy Eucharist: For example: Danger of spillage & profanation, confusion of teaching regarding the Real Presence in one species (e.g. thinking Christ is not received fully and entirely under one species alone), Concern regarding unsanitary conditions when using a 'shared cup' (including concerns regarding remnants of lipstick, saliva, etc., which may remain in the chalice). Prohibitive cost and difficulty of obtaining enough wine for all the faithful present (in some areas).

Receiving is not about quantity but

reverence: Think of this like sunlight through a window. Whether one ray or many, the same sun shines to all. What matters is the heart with which you receive. Like the sun, which shines to all the people, but stationed from one place. The same applies to Christ in any specie either Body or Blood, he fills us and sanctifies us.



When the chalice is offered to the laity: When permitted, the faithful may receive from the chalice. But when it is not offered, nothing is taken away from you. Christ gives Himself entirely every single time.

N.B. My dear brethren, the Eucharist is not a symbol to be divided but a Mystery to be adored. Whether you receive under one species or both, Christ gives you all of Himself. Approach him with faith, humility, and love. When you proceed to receive Holy Communion feel free to receive communion in one species or two if granted, and feel free to receive Holy Communion on your tongue, it is a polite, safe, and much easier way to avoid abuse and profanation.
