Blessed Salt Is A Strong Weapon Against Evil!

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In the Catholic Church, blessed salt is a sacramental, a sacred sign blessed by the Church that disposes the faithful to receive grace, but it is not a sacrament and does not confer grace in itself.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 1667) defines sacramentals as, “sacred signs which bear a resemblance to the sacraments.” Blessed salt is one such sacramental, traditionally used in the Church since biblical times.

The Devil Hates Blessed Salt for One Reason, because it reminds him of his defeat, Salt purifies, Salt preserves, Salt restores, Salt protects.

BIBLICAL UNDERSTANDING

Blessed Salt is a Spiritual Weapon. In scripture it is used as a symbol of Purification, Protection, Covenant loyalty, Preservation against corruption.

From the Old Testament, salt is mentioned as a covenant symbol and preservative (Leviticus 2:13). In the ancient world salt was valuable and used in sacrifices, hospitality, and healing. In the Gospel of Mathew 5:13 and Mark 9:49-50 Jesus teaches about the salt of the earth.

In the early church the exorcists used salt as a powerful sacramental and it was used with catechumens before baptism, in exorcisms, and in the blessing of holy water.

Church teaching: The value of blessed salt lies in its spiritual symbolism and the faith of the user, not in the salt itself. As with all sacramentals, it is a means to draw closer to God, not an end in itself.

HOW TO USE BLESSED SALT IN YOUR HOME:

Blessed Salt Cleanses What Evil Tries to Corrupt: But blessed salt carries a prayer specifically asking God to: cast out every unclean spirit, drive away every influence of the enemy, protect the place where it is used, restore what has been spiritually damaged. According to Catholic tradition and the Roman Ritual, a priest may bless salt with a prayer such as: “Almighty God, we ask you to bless this salt, as once you blessed the salt scattered over the water by the prophet Elisha. Wherever this salt (and water) is sprinkled, drive away the power of evil, and protect us always by the presence of your Holy Spirit. Grant this through Christ our Lord. Amen.”

Sprinkle it at your houses, in cars and boats, or add a pinch to food asking God to protect body and soul. Put some in the four corners of your home, Sprinkle as you walk the perimeter of your house, Bless your doorways and windows, bring a small amount with you when traveling. Some people like to add it into the foundation when having a new home built. Sprinkle it around your bed (for example when ill or when you have insomnia). Spray it in a child’s room when they’re afraid of the dark.

NB. Ask a priest he will guide you on how to use it. Blessed salt is not magic and not superstition. Its power comes from: the prayer of the Church, the authority of Christ, the faith of the believer, it should not to be used superstitiously, as if the salt itself has magical power. Its efficacy comes from God’s action through the Church’s prayer, and it is meant to focus the faithful’s faith on Christ.

Blessed salt should be disposed of with dignity e.g. dissolving it in Holy water or burying it.

Mary's Journey - Theotokos

Mary's Pregnancy in weeks 25-27.



Baby may grow to about 15½ inches and weigh around three pounds. He will open his eyes and practice breathing and swallowing more. He may experience hiccups as his lungs continue to develop.



Baby's startle reflexes and muscle tone are developing. You may be able to hear His heartbeat by pressing your ear to Mary's stomach at 27 weeks.

Mary's hair may seem thick and lustrous because normal hair loss is suppressed by pregnancy hormones. She may also experience mild swelling in extremities and should avoid sitting or standing for long periods of time and should stay hydrated.

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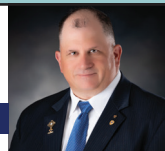
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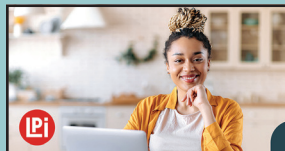
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
