




"Where is the newborn king of the Jews?" Matthew 2:2

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Saving over 14,000 Korean refugees during the Korean war in what is still the largest marine rescue in the history of the world, Servant of God Leonard LaRue's bravery and love of the Lord inspired his cause for sainthood to be opened in 2021.

PRAYER

God, our Father, Creator of the seas, Protector of refugees, and all those in need, You called Captain Leonard LaRue to recognize Your Son Jesus Christ in the faces of the Korean refugees, and led him as Brother Marinus to a life of prayer and service in the tradition of St. Benedict.

May his life be an inspiration to us and lead us to greater confidence in Your love so that we may continue his work of caring for the people of the sea, welcoming those who are refugees from war, and deepening all the faithful in their prayer and work of service.

We humbly ask that You glorify Your servant Captain Leonard LaRue/ Brother Marinus, O.S.B. on earth according to the design of Your holy will, and the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. Through Christ our Lord.

Epiphany is when we recall the three magi coming to visit the newborn king, Jesus. All of us are familiar with the song, "We Three Kings". It is based on Matthew 2: 1-12. The Magi remind us that Jesus came for all people, Jews and Gentiles and that he is the Messiah for the entire world.

Indeed, the Catholic Church encompasses people of every race, language, and nation on earth. Sometimes we struggle to overcome distances created by cultural and language barriers. In Nebraska, this is becoming more of a reality. I have served many multicultural parishes as a priest. Although there were challenges with language and the diversity of traditions and customs, it also brought a richness to the parish life.

The Magi came bearing gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Gold is given to symbolize the royalty of Christ, frankincense symbolizing his divinity, and myrrh symbolizing his death.

Some Catholics have the tradition of dedicating their house to the Lord for the new year by reading John 1: 1-3, 14 then using a piece of chalk and writing about the door, "+ 20; then underneath the date, *Christus, Mansionem, Benedicat*, 23+. The words mean *May Christ bless this house*. 2 + C+ 0 + M + B + 23.

Near the entrances of the church are handouts that have various blessings for your home such as blessing of the home on Epiphany and an Epiphany table blessing. Please help yourself.

The Phase II team has been working with RDG architect and MSL construction company to finalize the plans for Phase II building project. There will be a parish meeting in late January to show the parishioners the plans. It is hoped that ground breaking will be the week after Easter.


